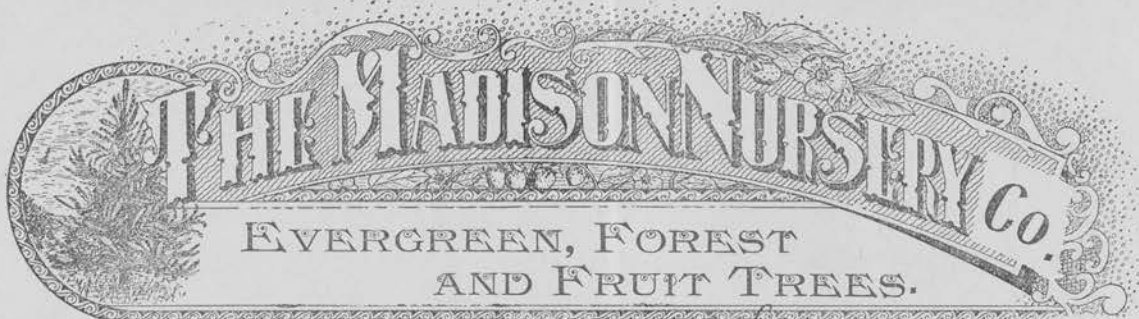

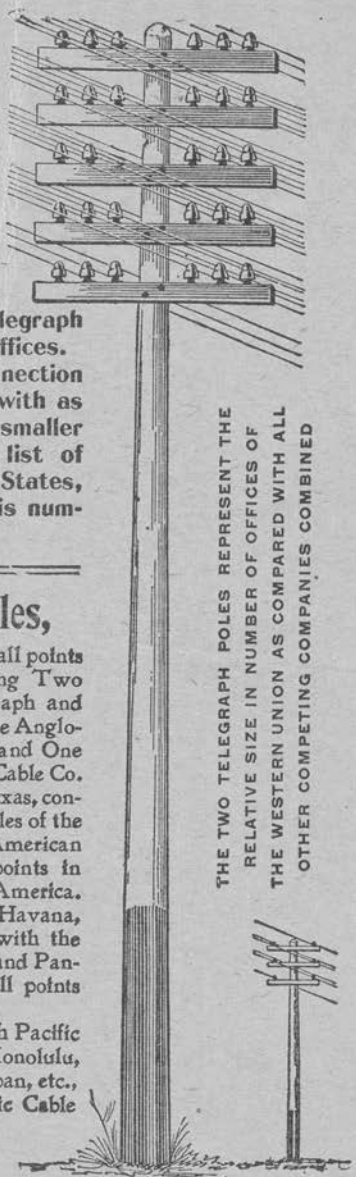

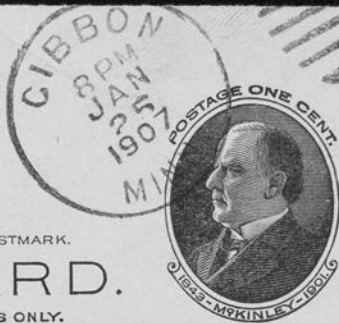

Dear Sir;

Your kind favor of the 16th received. Glad to know that you were not completely paralyzed. We were also afflicted with the same disease when we noticed the inventory of a certain nursery company, which, last year, we understood, had only two hundred and forty acres, all told. We see they are advertising that they are the largest growers of nursery stock in the Northwest.

By actual measurement we have over six hundred acres in nursery stock, and we feel that it is best to keep from thirty to fifty per cent. additional land idle for preparation, fertilization, etc. but when we come to figure that 1,728,000 apple trees growing Oct. 1st would take about one hundred and seven acres and that 5,000,000 rooted willows and poplars growing Oct. 1st would take about one hundred and seventy acres, and with thousands upon thousands and hundred's of thousands of other stock we didn't see how it could all be put on two hundred and forty acres, hence the symptoms of paralysis.

The one who gets out inventory last has one advantage. We suppose if we were to advertise we had ten thousand acres and ten million apple trees, etc. etc., it would be accepted for publication. But there is a limit even to the stretch of our rubber.

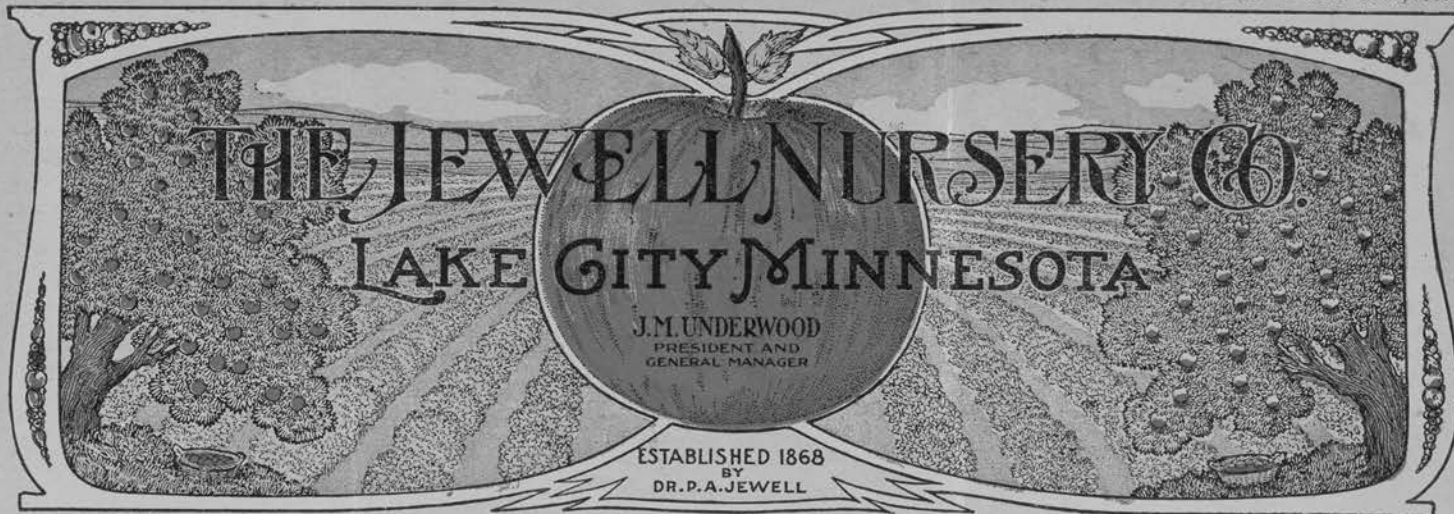
Replying to your recent card it will be impossible for me to be on hand Monday to assist you in getting things in readiness for the meetings but will endeavor to be there Tuesday.

We do not know of any seed that was left there for me. Roy said that some party came and brought a bag of seeds that was to be turned over to me. This is the first I have heard of it. Send it at our expense by express. Thank you for calling our attention to the matter.

I was not present Tuesday when the paper upon "Educating Nursery agents" was read. I understand the discussion was quite violent and that Mr. Austin, Excelsior, Minn. particularly made uncomplimentary remarks regarding nursery agents in general. Several of our men who were present at that time have entered protest against such remarks and make exceptions to them. If the matter has been reported to me correctly, I do not believe it would be wise and judicious on the part of the society to print these remarks in their report. I merely mention this as a suggestion. Our Bulletin for January 1st will contain a letter from one of our agents relating to this paper. Will send you marked copy of it, as it forces the sentiment of the number of worthy men on our force.

Mr. Austin is a sore-head. He took an agency with us, went to Rhodes, N. D., asked us to reserve territory for him exclusively. We did so for three months. He sent in no business. We put two men in his territory, one a minister and both honest men. They put in a delivery almost in his neighborhood of several hundred dollars and Mr. Austin entered in protest. We wrote him that we would reserve territory for three months without receiving a dollarsworth of business, and we knew that other companies were canvassing the territory with good results. We therefore decided to send the above men into the field. He was very angry and returned the outfit. We have never heard from him since. I presume he had our company in mind when he made his remarks and was making a drive at us, but we do not know. These are the facts in consideration.

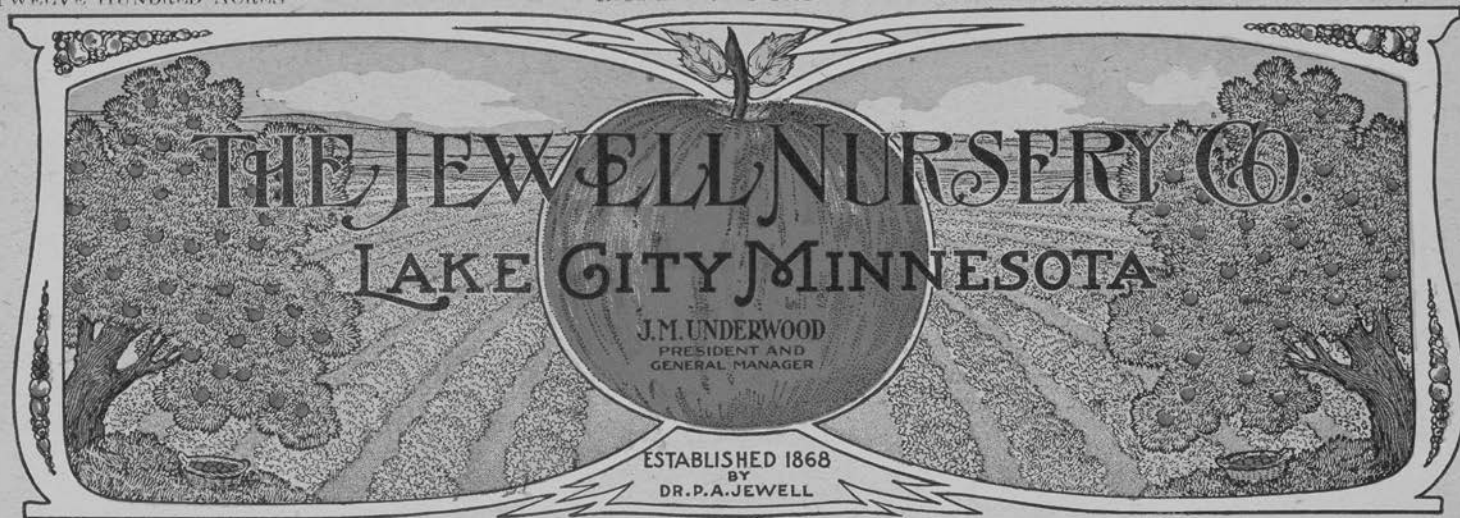
