a small number of men,
among whom was Mr Westman

located one mile south of
town. Their purpose

to cross the river at that²
point (that is the dam),
and procure some timbers
to use at the Quarry.
for what purpose I do
not know, and of no value
as relating to the death
of Mr Westman.

The water was pretty
high and rough at the
time, and looked to
dangerous to the men,
and no one would attempt
crossing the river, but
Mr Westman volunteered
to cross in a row boat
when he got into ~~and~~

midstream³ he lost
control of ^{the} boat and
it capsized and
threw him out. He
immediately went down
and did not appear for
some time at last he
came up about 150 feet
from where he was thrown
out of boat. He then
made an effort to swim
but went down, and was
not seen again. His
body was not recovered
the last time I heard.

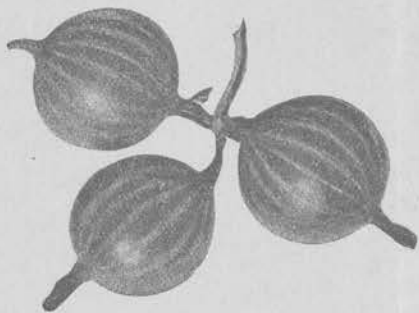
Dear Fellow Member:

Permit me to call your attention to the fact that all applications for plant premiums must be made not later than April first, and in case the annual fee for 1907 has not been paid it must accompany the application.
