I herewith send in my claim
for for the \$1000 I paid out for experimental
stock for the Jeffers Trial Station.

Proff Hansen sent me a fine collection including
several varieties of his crosses that I did not
order - as they were not on his list. most of his
crosses the 1 yr old trees were set freely with
fruit buds and will blossom this spring.
we have Mr Hansens cross between the Gaud
Cherry and the Peach.

I have put out grafts Ten or twelve varieties
of Japanese plums - & Pap Hybrids.
About the fruit prospects it looks a little hard.
The apple crop will be about nothing, no bloom
and plums they are in full bloom now. and bad
weather - east wind and lots of rain. there has been
only one day of decent weather (May 12th) since they began
to bloom. The Wyan^{ts} had evidently all been

killed before they come into full blossom
think they froze. The other varieties appeared to be
all right. Strawberries are looking fine.
and raspberries are in better condition
than they were a year ago.

for some reason I do not get the Horticulturist
I dont know as I have received any of them in 1908
certainly none since February.

I thought that I was all right on your books.
the 1907 Report was sent me by mail. I dont find
my membership ticket, but I think I remember
getting it all right, but I have never had any
use for them, and have not taken pains to send it

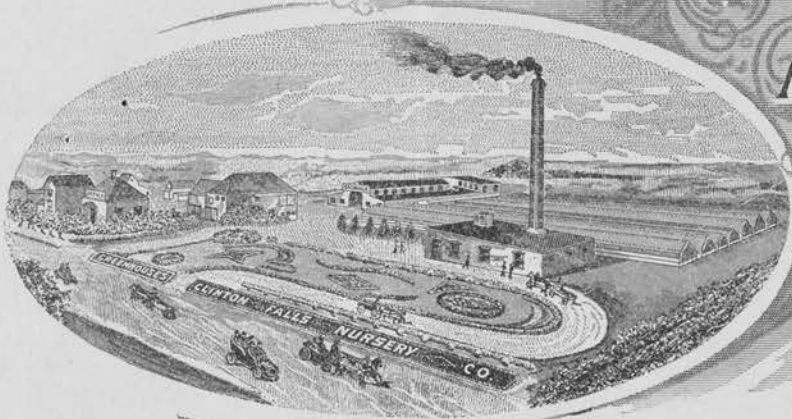
