Prices are quoted for immediate shipment only, and

SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE.

All orders are received subject to changes in price and to contingencies of transportation, strikes and other unavoidable delays. Except in case of term contracts, sales are made only at price in effect on date actual shipment is made, and orders filled only at price in effect at that time, regardless of price at time order is received.

Delivery to railroad company in good order at initial point of shipment, properly consigned to purchaser, shall be considered delivery to consignee, and the fact that a delivered price at some other point is made, or freight is prepaid by this Company, shall not change this rule as this is done solely for the convenience of purchaser.

If carrier is not designated in placing the order, we shall have the right to select the carrier.

Settlements for shipments in car load lots will be accepted only on basis of Western Railway Weighing Association weights at point of shipment on coal shipped from docks, or on basis of mine weights on coal shipped "all rail."

Accounts not paid by the fifteenth of the month succeeding shipment, subject to sight draft without further notice.

Accounts payable by bank draft on St. Paul, Minneapolis, Chicago, New York, Superior or Duluth. No exchange or express charges allowed.

Interest at 7 per cent per annum may be charged on all past due accounts.

Whenever contracts are made providing for minimum and maximum quantities or for a stated quantity, we shall only be required to furnish to the party, if a consumer, such quantity between the minimum and maximum quantity as shall be required by the party between the dates named in the contract for actual use in the business carried on by the party at the date of the contract, and if a retail dealer in coal as shall provide for the requirements of the party's ordinary and usual retail trade in towns where buyer was in business at date of making contract.

When no provision is made in contract as to manner of delivery, the quantity provided for in the contract shall be delivered in equal monthly proportions, and in such case, or in case where proportionate monthly deliveries are provided for, in case of the failure of the purchaser to order and accept such monthly proportionate quantity the first party shall have a right at its election to deduct the quantity undelivered from the total tonnage to be delivered under contract.
