

Dear friend: In one of your recent letters you wished to know the amount of apples I raised this year and also prices received. I have just sold the last of my walthys. In all I sold 445 bushels which brought \$435⁰⁰ in this are included about 20 bushels culls which sold for 50¢ bu. if these are deducted the average price would be about \$1.00 per bushel for all varieties. The principal varieties were Duchess Walthy and Whitney crab, with a few of yellow T. Tetofsky, Hadd, Hibernial and some others. Think the Hibernial should be condemned at least in southern part of state, with me it is a poor bearer, poor keeper, and hard to sell at any price, where other apples are in market. ~~The~~ The trees that produced this crop occupies about 2 acres of ground; These acres have been the best paying on the farm for many years. This being the third successive good crop I have had

Dear friend:- I am sorry to say that I was unable to get a photo of berry field this summer, our photographer is a new man at the business not much good, and then he did not want to come out unless he could take at least one dozen, and did not feel that I had use for them, and then maybe get poor ones at that, I send you one I had taken of field last fall, it is not very plain so do not know if you can use it.

I had a fair crop of Strawberries, not near a full crop, we have had too much rain, the distillate varieties did not fertilize good on account of wet and damp weather at blossoming, prices however were very good so results are quite satisfactory. Apples promise a heavy crop of all leading varieties. Duchesne, Waltham, and Whitney best. I am dissatisfied with Hibernia, and of course you can hardly sell them if you do get any.
