Dear Sir:-

Some days ago we brought to your attention, the subject of the NATIONAL APPLE SHOW, explaining its purpose and giving a general idea of the large total of premiums to be offered.

In this connection, we would say that we expect to offer as a first premium to the winning apple of each Standard Commercial variety, a grand prize of the value of \$1,000.00, and in addition to this, other prizes of a value never equalled, as special premiums. The size of the apple is by no means to be construed as the sole winning feature. There is to be considered in this award,- the quality, uniformity in size, flavor, color, etc., of the competing entries; the scale of points to be announced later.

In your section of the country there are certainly apples grown that should be entered at the NATIONAL APPLE SHOW in competition with all, and we believe that an opportunity presents itself to the grower in your neighborhood to win some of the grand special and first prizes.

For this reason we hope that your section will be well represented, and the suggestion is here offered that such apples as win distinction at your fairs this fall be placed in cold storage until such time as they will have to be shipped here, and the same suggestion applies to any exhibit outside of prize winners.

There are, no doubt, many orchardists who would like to exhibit their product, but who will not be able to accompany their display. To such we give every assurance that they have been provided for. When the proper time comes, their apples can be sent out here and will be placed in the hands of a committee, who will arrange and take care of the display, thereby giving such exhibitor an opportunity of competing for premiums on an equal standing with those giving personal attention to exhibits.
