I have subject "Bulbs for Fall Planting" pretty well outlined. Will probably have paper written in a few days. It is not a very strong subject, as you state.

I could give you one upon "Pruning" taken from close observation as well as from suggestions from leading writers and practical men. If you would prefer this subject, would make the change. Advise at early convenience. Third subject which I have under way at some future time is "Hardiness."

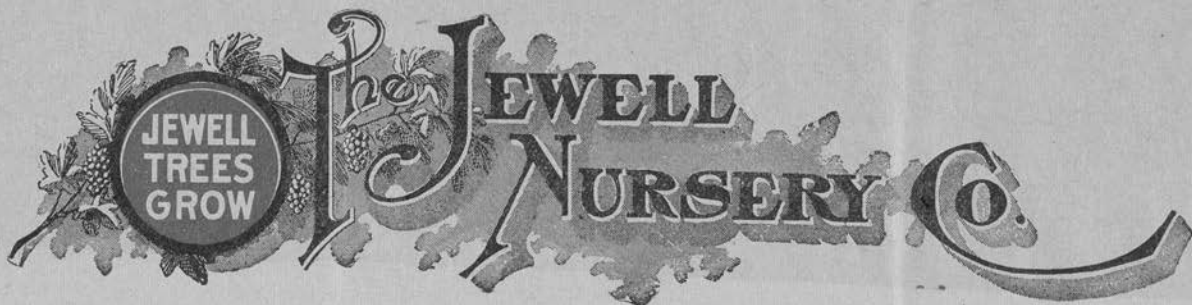
