My dear Sir:

I have yours of January 24th. I thank you for the information contained therein concerning the topworking of apples.

I was not in Iowa at the time of the meeting of the State Society and therefore did not see the Baltimore apples which you sent to that meeting. On making inquiry of Mr. Little of this department, I find that he has written you with regard to this fruit. He tells me that it was placed on exhibition.

I have been interested in the work which Mr. Ivins of Iowa Falls has been doing in topworking nursery stock. Mr. Ivins has made a special study of this subject and is doing good work. Mr. Elmer Reeves of Waverly, Iowa, attended the winter Short Course here in January. He speaks very favorably of Shields Crab as a stock upon which to topwork less hardy varieties of the apple. I wrote you because I wished to learn more with regard to this. Am sorry that you have had no experience with this variety. I hope some time to be able to publish the results of my inquiries and investigations along this line and I am very glad indeed to get the information which you have given me in your letter.

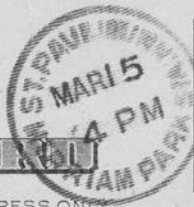
We wish you would stop sending
