But if desired we can send what we have to you by mail and next fall send you some more. The tree is very hardy being nearly 20 years old and never being sprayed or any thing of the kind.

and is sound and has no blemish
on it

The fruit is juicy and good eating
and keeps very good but these
we have left were kept in the
house to warm and are somewhat
withered but no signs of rotting
We will send you a few scions as
soon as possible

We also have four others one of
which is somewhat failing as*
the blight hurt it very bad and
it raised the largest fruit we have
being about $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches through on
the average and good keeping till
Christmas and later but it had none
last year, expect the frost hurt it.

10 bushels in one season of ^{fruit} apples
