Yes, you are right about one variety of the apples being marked wrong. Instead of Anisim it should have been Borovinka. It resembles the Duchess very much, but has a little darker stripes, and the tree is a healthier and stronger grower than the Duchess.


I do not believe it will be possible for me to attend the annual meeting in December, as I am a very busy man at that time of the year, and find it very difficult to get away.

My apples have all been eaten up or disposed of, so I could not make any exhibit at your meeting this time.

I hardly think that I could prepare any paper that would be of any interest to the other members of our society. I plant and care for the trees in the ordinary way, and meet with disappointments quite often, as I have been planting too many varieties. The only kinds to plant up here are those recommended by your society as of the first degree of hardiness. This year I had a heavy crop of all kinds of fruit, and it has been an object lesson to the people up here. Many have requested me to order trees for them for next spring's planting. People from Iowa and Illinois who have been up here this summer with a view of buying farms, have been agreeably surprised to find that such fine fruit would grow in this part of the State.

If I can spare the time to attend the annual meeting, I will do so; but, as I have said before, that is very uncertain.



I had an elegant crop of all kinds of fruit this year.

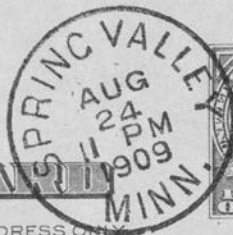
After you have received and examined the apples, I should be pleased to have you drop me a few lines, and tell me just what you think about them, and how they compare with those grown in the Southern part of the State.

Dear Friend, I enclose Paper on Top workings and there is none of ^{it} missing. I must have turned two pages in delimiting and supposed that I had lost a part of it. At the request of Prof Washburn I have been doing a little experimental spray work Just after blooming I sprayed one Block of trees once with Bar. mixture with 4 lbs arsenate of lead to 50 gal. water. And then Just after Blooming I sprayed another Block of trees with the same mixture with 2 lbs arsenate of lead to 50 gal. of the mixture. And then in 10 days I repeated on the second Block of trees with the same mixture and 2 lbs arsenate of lead

The main object of this work was to help destroy the Curculio. There were Duchess and Pat. Greening in both Blocks of trees. With the Duchess at this writing the one spraying with 4 lbs arsenate of lead done the most good. With the Pat. Greening I can see but little or no difference

In order to have reached your city in time to be present at the Summer Meeting in the fore noon ~~on~~ Tuesday it would have been necessary for me to leave home on Monday which was by far

the hottest day of the summer thus far. The thermometer stood at 90 and over with a most fearful humidity and I concluded at any time of life that in such weather the most safe and best place for me was at home. I am very much disappointed that I could not be with you but I dared not take the risk.






