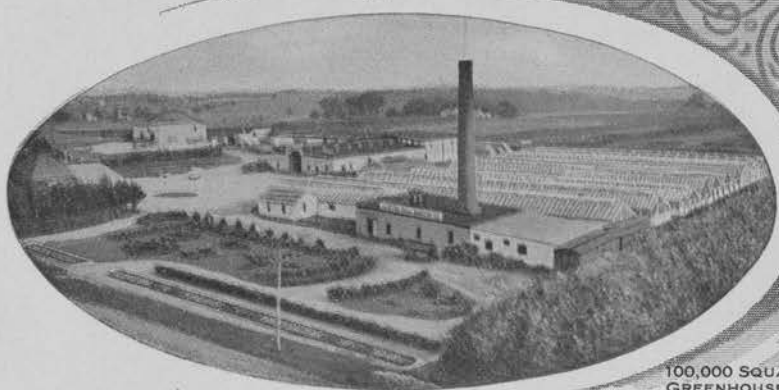
Friend Latham:-

Your favor of the 22nd received. In regard to report of the trial station will say that I handed that to Mr. Long, the short-hand reporter, while at the Meeting. I can send you another copy, if you wish it. I note what you say about photographs and will say that I am afraid we haven't any which are in any way connected with the station. I will, however, send you a photograph of our engine plowing trees. This was a great help to us in getting our work done up this fall. The day shift worked this machine cutting under trees and at night, another shift pulled eight plows with this engine. As to the present situation in regard to the delegation from this County, will say that I have been informed by the Sec'y of the local society that Robt. Crickmore, who is a member of the State Board and President of our local Society, informed him that he wanted our post master, Mr. J. M. Diment, Mr. J. R. Morley and himself to go as delegates from this county that they might have a solid delegation for Mr. Furlong. Now it is the duty of the Pres, Sec'y and Treas to represent the County Board in the event that no meeting is called for the purpose of naming delegates. The Treas here is a personal friend of Mr. Crickmore and, no doubt, will hand his proxy to one of the gentlemen designated by Mr. Crickmore. Mr. Crickmore can also do likewise as he is a member of the State Board and would be entitled to a vote, I presume by virtue of that office. The only way to get a look-in is either by calling a meeting or getting the Sec'y to hand his proxy to one who would vote right from our point of view which we may be able to do. However, the Sec'y does not wish to do this as he is afraid of going against the President's wishes. My brother and myself have discussed the advisability of presenting a petition requesting the Sec'y to call a meeting but, considering the personell of the members, we are under the impression that Mr. Crickmore would have no trouble in carrying his point if a meeting was called, therefore, we think it best to try and land one delegate, if possible and not ask for a meeting. I fear it would not be possible to secure the appointment as delegate representing the Horticultural Society as we have no local organization. The whole trouble being that Mr. Crickmore has control of the situation by virtue of his office. I will write Senator Moonan of Waseca, and ask him to do what he can for Mr. Underwood.
