Dear Mr. Latham

Your P.C. and letter of 27th inst. received on 28th and much pleased to get a line from you. In regard to your request about sending photo or of myself would say that I am afraid, am sorry to say, I ~~can~~ cannot promise to comply with unless I have photo taken here, as my last photo was taken in 1893 and that being 17 years ago I would present a rather too youthful appearance for my present age to be truthful. I do not believe in practising any deception in any matter.

I have taken very good care of myself right along and my general health is excellent as usual with exception above noted and very poor eyesight and very wear in left hip. I take just as much interest of what is going on in the economic and political field as ever and my heart feels young and hopeful for my age.

I cannot promise to send the article requested by you, but I will certainly try and do so and may possibly send you photo of self if I can have one taken in time as I want enough of them to go around for each one of my children two of them. It very likely ^{will} be the last one taken if 17 year periods are to intervene between takings.

It is with deep regrets I notice report in a Minneapolis paper about Mrs. S. M. Owens serious illness. No one can wish with more fervency for his early recovery than myself or friendship is of 25 years or more duration and the longer I knew him the more I appreciated him. He is one of us, and one of true nobleness of character and worth and of whose friendship any one should feel proud. I do not despair yet that he will be preserved to us for some years yet.

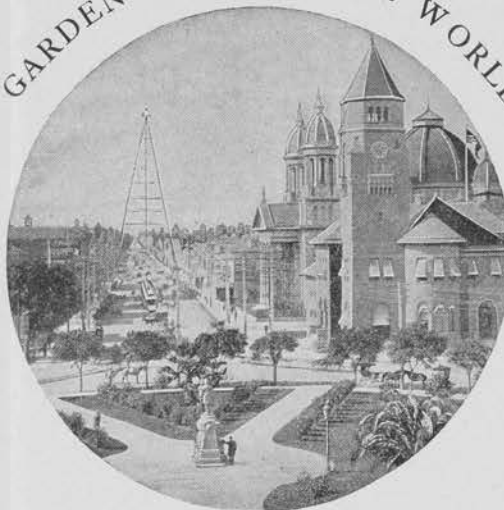

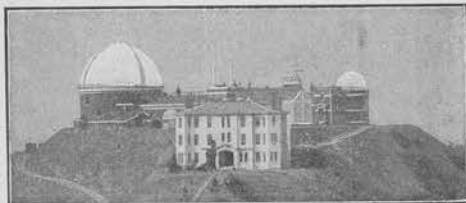

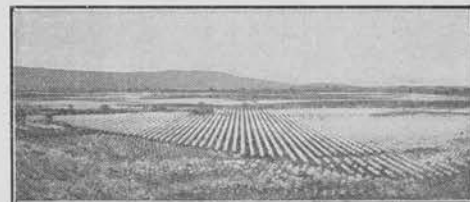
