Dear Sir:-

Replying to your letter of the 21st inst. relating to shipping and out material by express to the various institutions of the State asking how you are to obtain the express rates for such shipments.

Will say that all the Express Companies are required by law to keep a complete file of their tariffs at their office, so that if you would prepare a list of the stations to which you are in the habit of shipping and apply to the Express Company, you could obtain all the rates that you desire.

Of course, we have a complete file of these rates in this office and the same would be at your disposal at any time you might deem it convenient to come over and take whatever information you may require from them.

This is the only suggestion that the Commission can make, as there is no law compelling Express Companies to furnish copies of these tariffs to the public.
