We respectfully call your attention to the enclosed circular letter.

It is our desire to have as many States represented as possible, and we have set aside a very prominent space for this purpose. The exhibits from the various States will be artistically displayed, and a neat sign placed on each exhibit, explaining where the fruit was grown. If we are furnished with the name of the grower, this will also appear on the sign. We wish to secure from the various Horticultural Societies from one to five boxes of exhibit fruit with the name of the grower attached. You can readily understand that we are particularly anxious to secure a fine exhibit from Minnesota. In all other cases we require that the exhibit fruit be turned over to us as our property after the Exhibition, but being desirous of securing an exceptionally fine exhibit from our own State, we will make you a special concession and turn over the Minnesota Exhibit Fruit to the Minnesota State Horticultural Society after the Exhibition. If you will kindly have forwarded to us by express a box or barrel of your extra fancy apples, to arrive here about October 25th, selected expressly for the purpose, we will see that a creditable display is made and due credit given.

Dear friend

I am about leaving the farm and have bought a house in Owatonna. I dread the change to idleness after my years of labor. So thought I would like to talk on Horticultural in the farmers institutes if you think I would "fill the bill." I don't know very much but am willing to tell what I do know and to learn more. I was for many years an advocate of good roads & for eight years was Overseer of highways in this District.

As to my ability in constructing and maintaining roads I can refer you to Hon James E. Child president 1st Nat Bank Wasca or to Senator John Worman. If you would care to recommend me for this work I ^{will} do my best.

Our president Prof Green has left us
our sorrow is great for while many departments
will miss him it seems to me that the horticultur-
al society will feel his loss most keenly.

I ^{just} ^{know} ^{him} only a few years & never intimately
but respected and admired him greatly.

I did have perhaps half a crop of apples in
my old orchard but many of them were wor-
-ed & russeted by the frost. Codlin moth & green
Aphis were very plentiful. I sprayed my trees
three times twice with lime Sulphur and
the last time with bordeaux I mixed white
arsenic with both kinds for the trees without
fruit but my family were afraid of my
using it on the fruit so I omitted it, but think
it would have been better to have used it or
arsenate of lead. I found the lime Sulphur
excellent on my currants where they were
nearly ruined by worms.


Yours of the 5th is received
