Dear Sir:

I have received an intimation from the secretary of our society, Mr. Latham, that you are getting interested in the publication of a new periodical devoted to horticulture and fruit growing to be established at Howard Lake.

Now, (I have learned from several bitter experiences) that it is a thankless task to offer advice on matrimonial or horticultural undertakings but I am going to make a fool of myself just once more by suggesting that you don't do it.

I have been through the mill myself, having published what I regarded a fairly respectable fruit paper for three years. The only lucky thing about it for me being that I was finally able to sell it out to a friend, who as I last heard from was traveling a down hill road to the poor-house.

It is not a great trick to get the paper started and make a good showing for the first few months and even to get a fairly good roll of subscribers. But the heavy tug of war comes in when you go after those same subscribers to get a renewal and to increase your subscription list beyond the narrow limits of the band of horticultural cranks.

You know these are the days of combination and big enterprises. Instead of a matter of ten or a dozen daily papers in Minneapolis and St. Paul as there used to be they have been combining until there are only four daily papers in the state of any account, and it is so with all periodicals. It now takes a large capital to run a creditable paper with illustrations and first class editorial work.

The farm papers of the state now have an immense capital back of them and the accumulated experience and machinery of years, and each of them gives enough horticulture to meet the requirements of all except perhaps half a dozen people in each county of the state. And these ~~are~~ exceptions are already supplied with horticultural literature in the shape of bulletins and magazines magnificently illustrated, more than they are able to read.

Thinking over my associates and acquaintances in my own neighborhood I cannot think of one ~~man~~ whom I would be able to persuade to subscribe for a new paper, and we have more live horticulturists here than in any other locality in the state.

I hope you will take no offense at my plain advice. I suppose that I have nothing to gain or lose in the matter one way or the other but I confess to having been much interested in your experiments with the delicious Apole and other horticultural matters. You have made such a success in the past that I hate to see you undertake a lost cause and spend your hard earned cash and magnificent enthusiasm where it is fore-doomed to failure.

I have a small affair in the Horticultural line on my mind since last Spring that I have thought might be of benefit to the Horticulturalist. About 25 years ago I bought 6 apple trees - 4 of them proved hardy of good quality - The other two gradually gave up and died to the ground - Sprouts from came up from the root, which I let grow until they bore some very small sour apples - Then I grafted these sprouts 4 to 5 feet from the ground.

The grafts were healthy and have given a few apples - one of the trees had a branch of the original sprout which appeared to be vigorous - After the freeze last Spring all the young sprouts of the original were found badly frosted and lost all their leaves - but recovered later.
