This is a contest conducted each year by the Horticultural Division for a prize of \$25.00, which is the income of a fund of something over \$500 raised by subscription among members of the State Horticultural Society as a memorial to Peter M. Gideon. The principal has been invested by the Board of Regents and the income, amounting to about \$25.00 each year, is to be expended by the Professor of Horticulture to promote interest in horticultural work.

This prize has usually been divided into a first prize of \$12.00, a second of \$8.00 and a third of \$5.00, and given in the order named for the three best essays on horticultural topics. The winners in the contest this year are given above.


