

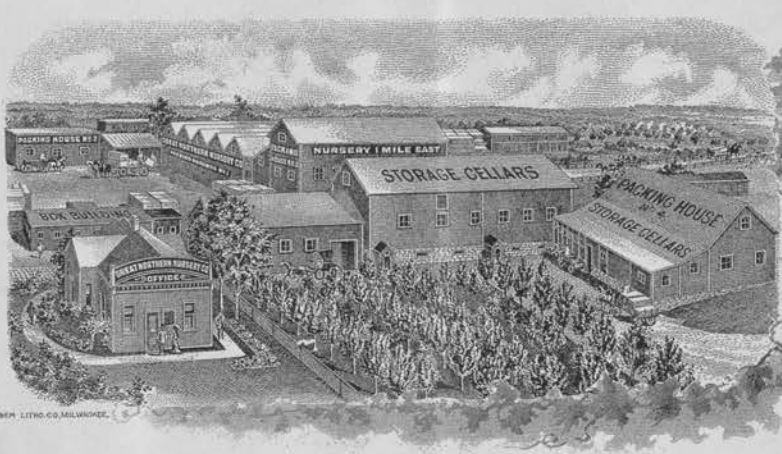
Your letter of the 5th, inst, to hand, In reference to folders, You may mail us 500 folders with our name on,

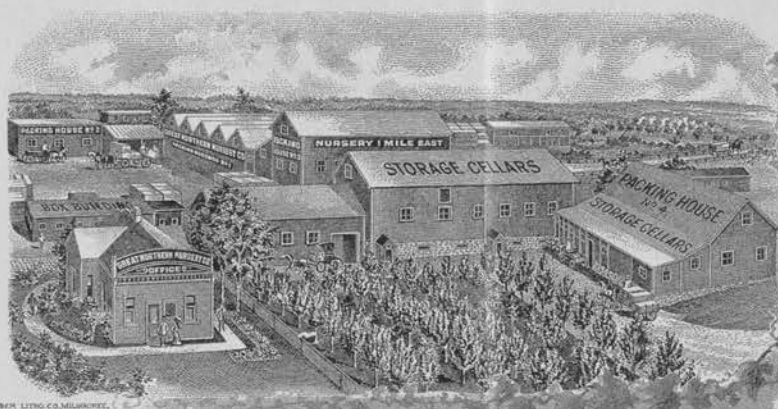



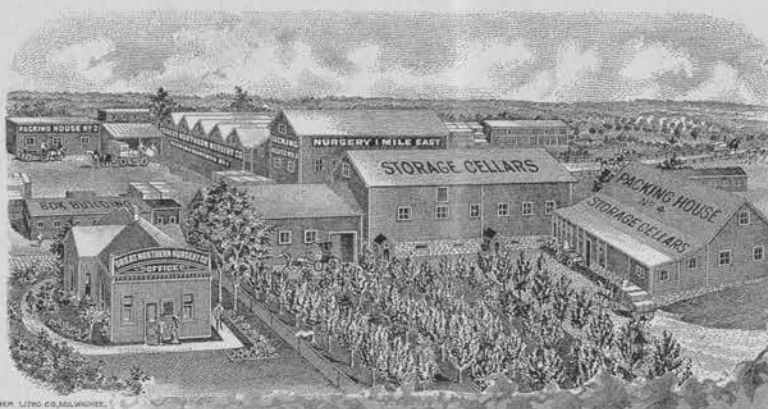

I am confident, from what I have heard of your meetings in Minnesota, the writer will be well pleased with the program referring to the growing of fruit in your state.

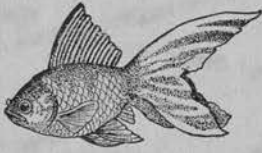
