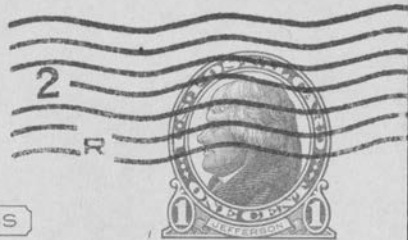
Jan 20, 1917
