Gentlemen: Your Standing Committee on Licenses to whom was referred the matter of regulations governing the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquors has given the same careful attention and begs leave to report as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the following regulations be adopted governing the sale of non-intoxicaing malt liquors by all licenses operating under licenses issued in Hennepin County, Minnesota, by this Board, effective as of March 13th, 1939.

The license shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the premises named therein and said premises shall at all times, while open to the public, be also open to inspection and examination by any peace officer or other law enforcing officer of the State.

The premises named in the license shall be kept clean and in a sanitary condition conforming to all the requirements of the State Board of Health.

"On Sale" licensees shall provide on said premises not less than two toilets one to be designated for men and the other to be designated for women. All glasses and other containers used in dispensing non-intoxicating malt liquor shall be thoroughly cleansed before they are again used for such purposes.

Such glasses and containers shall be cleansed by washing in hot water containing an abundance of soap or other equally effective cleansing agent; then rinsed in clean water to remove the soap or other cleansing agent, and then immerse said glasses and containers for not less than two minutes in clean hot water maintained at a temperature of at least 170° Fahrenheit.

No license shall be issued to any person who has been convicted of a felony or who has been convicted two or more times of any crime other than a felony or who shall be found guilty of violating any of the liquor laws of the State.

No licensee shall sell or serve any non-intoxicating malt liquor to any intoxicated person or permit any intoxicated person to remain on the premises named in his license.

No "On Sale" licensee for the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor shall sell any such malt liquor, nor shall any "On Sale" licensee serve or permit to be served or consumed on the premises named in the license any such malt liquor, on any primary, general, special or township election day during the hours the polls are open, or on Sunday between the hours of Two (2) o'clock A. M. and Twelve (12) o'clock noon, or on any other day between the hours of One (1) o'clock A. M. and Six (6) o'clock A. M.

No "Off Sale" licensee for the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor shall sell any such malt liquor on any primary, general, special or township election day during the hours the polls are open, or on Sunday between the hours of 2 O'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock A. M., or on any other day between the hours of One o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock A. M.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a violation of any of these regulations shall be cause for revocation of the license by this Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the regulations governing the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor adopted July 1, 1935, and amended July 17th, 1935, and amended August 21, 1935, be and the same are hereby modified and amended to conform herewith.
