The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A. M., pursuant to law.

Member present: Commissioner Alexander.

Members absent: Commissioners Ainsworth, Dickman, Heffelfinger and Scott.

There being no quorum present, it being a legal holiday, the Board recessed until Tuesday, January 2, 1945 at ten o'clock A. M.

Tuesday, January 2, 1945

At ten o'clock A. M., the meeting was called to order by Deputy County Auditor, H. A. Erickson.

Nominations for the selection of a Chairman of the County Board of the County of Hennepin for the year 1945, were called for by Deputy County Auditor. Commissioner Heffelfinger made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, that G. W. Alexander be elected Chairman. Upon roll call, all members voted for Mr. Alexander, and he having been unanimously elected, the Deputy County Auditor, H. A. Erickson, was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Mr. Alexander as Chairman. This he did, and G. W. Alexander was declared Chairman of the County Board for the year 1945.

Chairman Alexander thanked the Board for the honor conferred upon him, and called for a selection of a vice-chairman for the year 1945. Commissioner Dickman made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that Commissioner W. W.

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Heffelfinger be elected Vice-Chairman. Upon roll call, all members voted in favor of said motion, and Chairman Alexander declared Commissioner Heffelfinger Vice-Chairman of the County Board for the year 1945.

At 10:15 o'clock A. M., the Board proceeded to open bids, as follows:

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all tabular matter or what is termed price and one-half or "double price" composition contained in said publications; also to furnish without additional cost to the County of Hennepin forty-five copies of each daily issue of said Finance and Commerce, and to furnish twenty-five bound copies of said proceedings substantially conforming with the 1940 volume, for 90¢ per printed page.

Beginning at the northwest corner of Section 20, Township 28 North Range 23 West in the county of Hennepin, State of Minnesota; which is the Northwest corner of Ft. Snelling Military Reservation; thence East on the Northerly line of said Section 994 feet to a point on the center line of the proposed road; thence turn right an angle of 68 degrees, 26 minutes and run in a Southeasterly direction 3610 feet to the beginning of a 5 degree curve to the left; thence along said curve 1001.3 feet measured on the tangents to the end of curve; thence continuing in a Southeasterly direction 1360.7 feet to the beginning of a 2 degree curve to the left; thence along said curve 337.3 feet measured on the tangents to the end of curve; thence continuing in a Southeasterly direction 291 feet to the beginning of a 5 degree curve to the right; thence along said curve a distance of 658.5 feet measured on the tangents to the end of curve in the middle of the present road which crosses the end of the Ft. Snelling Reservation, and leads to the ferry over the Minnesota River; thence along middle of said road 574.2 feet to the beginning of a 3 degree curve to the left; thence along said curve 197.8 feet measured on the tangents; thence in a straight line to the Easterly boundary of the said reservation; the said highway being 33 feet on each side of the center line thereof, as shown on said blueprint; -- and

WHEREAS, said permission was granted subject to the conditions which read in part as follows:

1. That the said road shall be constructed and maintained without expense to the United States.

* * * *

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3. That the use of said road and highway on the reservation shall be subject to such rules and regulations as may from time to time be prescribed by the military authorities to properly protect the interests of the United States; -- and

WHEREAS, the said permit was amended by terms of a supplemental permit dated January 27, 1928; and

WHEREAS, after the construction of said road and bridge (commonly referred to as the Mendota Bridge), the Commissioner of Highways for the State of Minnesota, pursuant to legal authority, took over and incorporated the same in the highway system of the State of Minnesota, thereby assuming the responsibility for the repair and maintenance of said road and bridge; that said road is designated Statutory No. 116 and is now marked by the said Commissioner as Trunk Highway No. 55;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That this Board hereby request the Secretary of War and the military authorities at Fort Snelling to relieve the County of Hennepin from any further obligation under said original permit and amendments thereto;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That three (3) copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Commanding Officer at Fort Snelling and one (1) copy to said Commissioner of Highways.
