Minneapolis, Minnesota Thursday, March 25, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Heffelfinger, Scott, and Chairman Matthews. Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The matter of the selection of a member of the County
Board to serve on the County Cooperative Extension Committee was
discussed, and Commissioner Hanson moved that Commissioner
Ainsworth be appointed to serve on said committee. Unanimously
carried.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting a new automobile was read and referred to L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, for specifications.

The matter of the lease between the County of Hennepin and the Hennepin County Agricultural Society was again considered by the Board. Commissioner Matthews set April 1st as the date for hearing on the matter and the Clerk was directed to notify the Fair Board of said hearing.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, recommending acceptance of the bids of Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company for dredging and weed removal in Lake Minnetonka, and for overhauling, painting, placing, removing, and storing spar buoys in Lake Minnetonka, was read and referred to the Committee on Lake Improvement.

Letters were received from William S. Ervin, Land Commissioner, with applications attached for the repurchaseof the lands described in said applications, and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings,

Mr. L. H. Tanglen, Superintendent of Schools, Hopkins, appeared before the Board relative to County owned land West of the Senior High School at Hopkins described as follows:

Commencing at intersection of S. line of Excelsior Avenue with West line of section, thence S. 608.12 ft, thence E. parallel with Excelsior Avenue a distance of 359.2 ft. thence North to S. line of said street, thence West to beginning, Section 24, Town-
