Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 4, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

Monthly reports were received from Harold C. Pederson,
County Agricultural Agent, Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and Donald C. Bennyhoff,
Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, and ordered placed on
file.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes were received and referred to the Committee on Licenses.

A letter from Paul S. Carroll, Judge of the District Court, requesting an appropriation from the Emergency Fund to the District Court Fund was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and Legal Department, Civil.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, with copy of Commissioners' Report filed with the Clerk of District Court, awarding damages for the taking of land for the Sheriff's radio broadcasting station was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from F. J. Hill, M.D., Commissioner of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Sick and Defectives.

A letter from the Board of Park Commissioners requesting the withdrawal from sale of certain tax forfeited lands was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings and Land Commissioner.

Letters were received from William S. Ervin, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the granting of an application signed by Harold G. Cant for the repurchase of tax forfeited land.
- 2. Submitting applications of the Village of St. Louis Park and the Village of Richfield for conveyance of tax forfeited land.
- 3. Submitting a list designated List #1 of tax forfeited lands suitable for timber development.

All of the above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A notice of reassignment of the hearing on the application of Joe and Delores Rein for a certificate of public convenience was presented and referred to the Engineer.

A petition signed by Esther McDonald and 63 others requesting dredging of the swamps in West Arm and Jennings Bay, Lake Minnetonka, was presented and referred to the Committee on Lake Improvement and Engineer.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, recommending acceptance of the bid of Astleford Equipment Company for two truck tractors was read and referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of April 30, 1948, was received from Robert F.Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and ordered published with the minutes and placed on file.

Specifications for rental of two wheel type tractors and scrapers on an hourly rental basis were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, and referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges.

A request from the American Veterans Committee for use of the Commissioners' Room at 7:00 o'clock P.M., May 11th was read and the Board gave unanimous consent for use of the room.

A recommendation from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County
Auditor, for the sale of two used tables was read and referred
