Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 1, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and nonintoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Licenses.

An offer for the purchase of an old Hennepin County gravel pit located on Cedar Avenue, near the Cedar Avenue bridge, was received from Mrs. Minnie Ericson and referred to the Engineer and Legal Department, Civil.

A letter from F. J. Hill, M.D., Commissioner of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Sick and Defectives.

An Order of the District Court approving resignations and the appointment of personnel at the Home School for Boys was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An Order of the District Court approving the reappointment of a Juvenile Court Psychologist was received and referred to the Committee on Home School for Boys. A letter from the Public Health Nursing Service requesting the appointment of additional personnel was read and referred to the Public Health Nursing Committee.

A letter from Carroll G. Patton, Examiner of Titles, requesting the retention of an assistant secretary was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, recommending the sale of three old desks was read and the Clerk was directed to notify Mr. Fitzsimmons to have the desks appraised and then submit a letter stating that the offer is equal to or better than the appraised value.

A letter from Waldron W. Douglas, Superintendent, Home School for Boys, requesting the purchase of staple foods was read and referred to the Committee on Home School for Boys.
