The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House, in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present ...

Leo A. Senesac and Paul S. Swensson, representing the Glen Lake Civic Club, appeared before the Board. Mr. Swensson addressed the Board briefly, requesting the County to dredge Glen Lake so as to make it available for use by the general public. The matter was referred to the Committee on Lake Improvement, to the Engineer, and to the Civil Legal Department for consideration.

A budget request for the Big Island Disabled Veterans Camp was received from Walter P. Quist, Chairman, Board of Governors of said camp, and referred to the Accounting Department of the County Auditor's office to be considered at the budget meeting.

Monthly reports received from Harold C. Pederson, County Agricultural Agent, Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, were ordered placed on file.

A statement of balances in County Revenue Funds as of June 30th, 1948, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was read and ordered published with the minutes and placed on file.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and beer were referred to the Committee on Licenses.

Four letters from F. J. Hill, M.D., Commissione of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of patients to the Glen Lake Sanatorium, were read and referred to the Committee on Sick and Defectives.

A notice received from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission ordering a hearing to be held on Thursday, July 15, 1948, at 11:15 o'clock A.M., at 401 State Office Building, St. Paul, Minnesota, on the application of Minneapolis, Northfield, and Southern Railway Company for authority to abandon and remove a wye track near the Auto Club, was read and referred to the Road and Bridge Committee and to the County Engineer.

A letter from Ann Hauser, R.N., Secretary of the Hennepin County Rural Public Health Nursing Committee, with attached report and recommendations of said committee covering employees in the Nursing Service, was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from the State Division of Social Welfare announcing the new per diem rate at the Minnesota State Tuberculosis Sanatorium was read and ordered placed on file.

A copy of Order No. 18709 received from M. J. Hoffmann, Commissioner of Highways, State of Minnesota, establishing detours on approximately 3.75 miles of Hennepin County roads, said detours to be designated as Temporary Trunk Highways No. 52, No. 152, and No. 218, was read and referred to the Road and Bridge Committee and the Highway Engineer.

A continued hearing on the offer of Independent School District No. 19 to purchase certain land from Hennepin County, scheduled for 10:30 o'clock A.M., today, was again continued to Tuesday, July 13, 1948, at 10:30 o'clock A.M. (See resolution).
