Minneapolis, Minnesota Thursday, August 5, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

A letter from William S. Ervin, Land Commissioner, requesting the transfer of lands described in attached lists "276-T" and "276-T" to the Village of Richfield, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, recommending the acceptance of the bids of Ruffridge-Johnson Equipment Company, and of Wm. H. Ziegler Company for two sand spreaders was read and referred to the Committee on Roads and Bridges.

Mr. Hoiby appeared before the Board requesting a favorable report on his application to the State Board of Aeronautics for permission to operate a seaplane base at Lake Minnetonka. R. C. Finley, President of the Village Council of Deephaven, addressed the Board stating that at a meeting of the residents of the area

28 persons were opposed to the granting of Mr. Hoiby's application, and 5 persons were in favor of it. J. E. Sorenson, Village Clerk of Deephaven, submitted a letter stating that the Village Council of Deephaven is objecting to the establishment of a seaplane base within the limits of the Village of Deephaven. J. F. Cooper and D. S.Defenbacher addressed the Board, stating that they were in favor of the establishment of the seaplane base.

County Board rescind its action of July 27th objecting to the granting of a permit to Mr. Hoiby to operate a seaplane base on Lake Minnetonka. Commissioner Scott offered an amendment to the motion that the matter be postponed for a period of 30 days and that the various Town and Village Boards be requested to advise the County Board whether or not they are in favor of seaplane bases at Lake Minnetonka. Voting on the amended motion was as follows:

Mr. Schutt addressed the Board on behalf of an application signed by E. G. Mr. Heffelfinger moved, seconded by Scott, to approve an application for cancellation of one-half of the ditch taxes, and that a new application be submitted to the County Board within 30 days. The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members werepresent.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of August 31, 1948, was received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and ordered published with the minutes of the Board, and placed on file.
