The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A. M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

Monthly reports from A. C. Eklund, Superintendent of the County Home and Harold C. Pederson, County Agricultural Extension Agent were read and ordered placed on file.

Applications for licenses to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquors were received and referred to the Committee on Licenses.

Contract and contract bond from the Republic Crecsoting Company for tar was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Assistant County Attorney, relative to a proposed bill for assessing benefited property on lake improvement projects was read and referred to the Engineer.

A letter from Robert E. Scott, County Superintendent of Schools, requesting the omission of School District No. 17 from a resolution adopted by this Board August 31, levying a tax on School Districts which maintain no classified secondary schools was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Orders No. 18956, 18957 and 18958 from the Commissioner of State Highways establishing detours were presented and referred to the Engineer.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, September 21, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

Mr. William Stehlek appeared before the board, representing a delegation of property owners living on the West shore of Black Lake, and requested the completion of dredging operations. Mr. Erick Jensen, Assistant County Engineer, stated that the dredging operations were not completed last year on account of insufficient funds and that now the Conservation Department requests that a survey be submitted before granting permission for dredging, and that dredging must be confined to channels. Mr. Scott moved, seconded by Ainsworth, that the matter be referred to the Committee on Lake Improvement and that the Engineer be directed to contact the Conservation Department to ascertain whether dredging operations could be completed if a survey were made.

Mr. Earl Maul, of Finance and Commerce, appeared before the Board relative to claims for publishing the proceedings of the County Board, stating that if past due accounts were paid up in full, he will be willing to carry the County for the balance of the year. The matter was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A monthly report from the Public Health Nursing Service was received and ordered placed on file.

Requests for use of the County Commissioners' room by Minneapolis Service Post #635, American Legion, on Friday, October 1, 1948, at 8:00 o'clock P.M., and by the Mayor's Committee, on Monday, September 27, 1948, from 4:00 to 5:00 o'clock P.M. were unanimously granted.

A letter from William S. Ervin, Land Commissioner, recommending that the division of forfeited lands located at E. Grant Street and 7th Avenue South be referred back to the Planning Commission for further study, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Barnard Clifford requesting pumping operations at Christmas Lake was read and referred to the Engineer.

A request from the Town Board of Corcoran for financial assistance in maintaining township roads was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the locations of the footings for the guy wires for the radio tower was read and ordered placed on file and a copy forwarded to the architects, Long & Thorshov, Inc.

A letter from the City of Hopkins offering to purchase Blocks 25 to 29 inclusive, West Minneapolis, for the purpose of securing fill was read, and Commissioner Ainsworth stated that he would take the matter up at a meeting with the Council members of the City of Hopkins this evening, and suggest that the Board would be willing to sell the fill but would prefer to hold title to the property.

A letter from the City of Hopkins requesting the leasing of Block 48 West Minneapolis for a playground and skating rink was read and Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Scott, that the property be leased to the City of Hopkins for a consideration of one dollar per year. Unanimously carried.

A petition for establishing a County Road running North and South on the section line on the East side of Section 6, Township 29, Range 23, being in the unplatted part of the Village of St. Anthony on one side and the County of Ramsey on the other side was presented to the Board and referred to the Legal Department Civil and Engineer.

A maintenance agreement from Clary Multiplier Corporation was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A report from the Sheriff's office relative to a traffic check on County Roads No. 6 and No. 18 was received and ordered placed on file.
