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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 26, 1949

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen, Hanson, Scott, and Vice Chairman Ainsworth. Member absent: Chairman Matthews.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A monthly report from the Public Health Nursing Service was received and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Mrs. Pat Kullberg requesting dock privileges on county owned property was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from E. H.Larson, Land Commissioner, with letter from the Department of Taxation attached, recommending the reconveyance of tax forfeited lands to the State of Minnesota was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a report on the accident of Dennis Smith, a County Highway Department employee. Referred to a meeting of the Road and Lake Committee to be held on April 28, 1949, at 2:00 o'clock P.M.
- 2. Recommending acceptance of the bid of Koppers Company, Inc. for tar. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- Reporting procedure on bids for the purchase of supplies.Ordered placed on file.
