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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 19, 1949

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

A monthly report received from Harold C. Pederson, County Agricultural Agent, was ordered placed on file.

Thirteen letters recommending the establishment of the proposed County Health Department were received from the following individuals and organizations: Mr. and Mrs. Morris C. Amren, Mrs. Helen M. Bettels, writing on behalf of a group of residents at St. Albans Bay, Dr. James A. Blake, Mrs. Howard Gonn for the Minneapolis Branch of the College Women's Club, O'Neill J. Grathwol, who enclosed a copy of a resolution adopted at a meeting which was attended by representatives from eleven Lake Minnetonka communities, Mrs. Lloyd Hale, President, League of Women Voters of Minneapolis, Mrs. Foght Jones, Mrs. S. B. McClocklin, Jr., Mrs. Raymond A. Pettersen, Mrs. Charles Raymond, Mrs. Elmer M. Rusten, George Sanberg, Clerk, Board of Education, Excelsior Public Schools, and Jack Snyder, Superintendent, Wayzata Consolidated Schools. The above letters were referred to Commissioner Christensen for review before being placed on file.

Six letters received from County Auditors of adjoining counties relative to bounties on wild foxes were read and referred to the County Engineer for tabulation.

Plats of "Louis E. Dvorak Addition" and of Wildcrest, both located in the Town of Minnetonka, with a letter from the Town Board approving the Wildcrest plat were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

An official bond covering an employee in the County Auditor's office was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A request from Dr. J. J. Heisler, Richfield Health Officer, for the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Three letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- l. Relative to attached resolution of the Village of St.
 Louis Park recommending the purchase of tax forfeited land for village purposes.
- 2. Recommending approval of the attached application of the Minneapolis Board of Park Commissioners for conveyance of tax forfeited land for park and playground purposes.

A letter from the Committee in Favor of Dissolution of School District No. 138, by John R. Clift, Secretary, with accompanying petitions signed by 277 electors favoring the dissolution of said school district were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A certificate from Robert C. Dressel, Clerk, giving the result of the vote at a meeting held on Monday, July 18, 1949, purporting to revoke the resolution adopted at a special meeting of Common School District No. 138 held on June 20, 1949, together with a copy of the official ballot, was referred to Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board.

An abstract of the bids received July 11, 1949 for road construction in and near Mound on State Aid Roads No. 7 and No. 15 was received from the State Department of Highways and ordered placed on file.

A report from County Engineer Zimmerman on completed Forfeited Tax Sale Project No. 49-1 in Block 4, Silver Lake Addition was ordered placed on file.

Mr. John Clift, Treasurer of School District No. 138 stated that the majority of the residents of District No. 138 wished to be set over into School District No. 89 (Meadowbrook). That District No. 138 has a small two room schoolhouse with 94 pupils, which is wholly inadequate. Mr. Clift suggested that the Board defer action until such time as to enable the residents of District No. 138 to vote on a bond issue.

Mr. Paetzel, Chairman of the School Board in District No.

138 suggested that the district be divided, the North portion to be attached to Robbinsdale and the South portion to be attached to St. Louis Park.

The Chairman of the School Board of District No. 89 (Meadowbrook) stated that their district could not absorb any part of School District No. 138.

Mr. Jack Snyder, Superintendent of Schools at Wayzata

stated that conditions at Wayzata would not permit them to absorb any part of District No. 138.

Mr. Cooper, Superintendent of Schools at Robbinsdale stated that they were converting rooms that had previously been used for recreational purposes into kindergarden rooms and that Robbinsdale could not absorb any part of District No. 138.

Mr. Paul Seamans of Golden Valley stated that the University of Minnesota was planning on making a survey of the school situation in rural Hennepin and that possibly any action should be held pending such a survey.

Mr. Biel stated that Golden Valley was a fast growing area and that in the near future would need a senior or junior high school.

Various parents expressed their opinions that the district should not be split up and that District No. 138 should be set over into District No. 89 (Meadowbrook).
