Tuesday, August 23, 1949

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Hanson and Scott.

Member absent: Chairman Matthews.

A monthly report from the Public Health Nursing Service was received and ordered placed on file.

Applications for licenses to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The disposition of the delinquent personal property tax list was discussed by the Board and representatives from the County Auditor's office, County Treasurer's office and Sheriff's office. The matter was referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Walter Hobot, President of the 12th Ward D.F.L. Club and Business Representative of the City and County Employees Union, addressed the Board protesting the adoption of a resolution by the County Board providing that not more than one member of a family should be employed at any one time by the Road and Bridge Department. Also a letter from the 12th Ward D.F.L. Club protesting the above resolution was read and the whole matter was referred to the next Board meeting.

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Mr. Anson Mase, of the Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company, addressed the Board relative to additional fill for the construction of a sea wall at Lake Minnetonka. The matter was referred to the Engineer.

A letter was received from Durham and Swanson, Attorneys for Martin L. Thompson, submitting a proposition to the Board relative to an easement for right of way over their client's property to relieve an unpleasantness which has developed over fishing privileges in the channel near his home. Commissioner Christensen moved that the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee call a public hearing on the matter for Thursday, September 1st at 2 o'clock P.M. Voting on the motion: Ainsworth; YEA; Christensen, YEA; Hanson, NAY; Scott, NAY. Motion not adopted.

Commissioner Hanson moved that the matter be referred to the Road and Lake Committee and Engineer. Voting on the motion: Ainsworth, YEA; Christensen, NAY; Hanson, YEA; Scott, YEA. Motion carried.

Frank Adams, Veterans' Service Officer, presented the Board with applications of Roger DeCharles, Harry Rappaport and Stanley Cowle for the position of Assistant Veterans' Service Officer. The Board proceeded to ballot on the applicants and Roger DeCharles received two votes, Harry Rappaport, one vote and Stanley Cowle, one vote. The result being the same on the second ballot, the matter was laid over.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, requesting an automobile for his department, was read and referred to the Engineer for specifications.

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A letter from F. J. Hill, M. D., Commissioner of Health, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from W. L. Lundgren and R. C. Newquist, owners of a double bungalow, relative to damages to their building caused by spattering of oil while resurfacing Excelsior Boulevard was read and referred to the Attorney and Engineer.

A letter from the City of Robbinsdale with resolution attached requesting the Board to continue dredging work on Crystal Lake as of the 1946 plans and to put in a dike from the sandpoint to the west shore as proposed, was read and ordered placed on file.

A notice of claim from Gerald R. Giebenhain for damages to his property caused by reconstruction of County Road #47, was read and referred to the Engineer and Attorney.

A letter from the Village of Morningside requesting financial assistance for improving village roads with claim attached, was read and referred to the Committee on Claims to be included with the list of claims at the next Board meeting.

A letter from C. L. Horn, Chairman of the Minnesota Emergency Conservation Committee enclosing a copy of his letter to Chester S. Wilson, Commissioner of Conservation relative to a private party availing himself of dredgings at Crystal Lake, was read and ordered placed on file.

An inspection report from Long and Thorshov, Architects for the Hennepin County Welfare addition, was received and ordered placed on file.

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A letter from the Public Health Nursing Service requesting temporary help during vacations was read and referred to the Nursing Committee.

Letters were received from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Requesting the withdrawal from sale of tax forfeited lands described in attached list 302-W; the combination of lands described in attached list 302-DC and the classification of lands described in the attached list 302-C.

2. Recommending approval of special assessments to appraised valuation of lands described in special assessment list 38. The above matters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A petition signed by John Mengelkoch asking that his lands be set off from School District 138 to Independent School District St. Louis Park and a petition signed by Verner M. Jensen asking that his entire lot be included in Independent School District St. Louis Park, were presented and referred to the Superintendent of Schools, Robert E. Scott.

A contract and contract bond from Arnell Business Forms for furnishing tax statements to the County Treasurer were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Leo D. Mosier, Secretary of a committee from the Hennepin County delegation of the Minnesota Legislature, offering their services for pending legislation before the legislature, was read and the Secretary to the Board was requested to send a letter of thanks to the Committee for their offer.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway

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Engineer, as follows:

1. Recommending that the Board refuse the request of the Village of Hopkins for the extension of 16th Avenue South, ordered placed on file and a copy forwarded to the City Council of Hopkins.
2. Recommending acceptance of the bid of the Republic Creosoting Company for tar, and Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
3. Report on the improvement of the extension of 86th Street in the Township of Bloomington, requested by Mr. Paust, referred back to the Engineer.
4. Requesting the transfer of funds from the Road and Bridge Fund to Kopper's, Inc. contract for tar. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
5. Reporting on the proposed lay-offs in the Road and Bridge Department. Ordered placed on file.
6. Report on road changes in the Village and Township of Champlin. Commissioner Christensen moved that this matter be referred back to the Road and Lake Committee until such time as the Board has completed its study of all roads to be traded with Villages and Townships for county roads. Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, to accept the report of the Engineer. Commissioner Christensen moved to amend the motion and that the matter be referred to the Attorney. Voting on the amended motion: Ainsworth, NAY; Christensen, YEA; Hanson, NAY; Scott, NAY. Amended motion not adopted.

Voting on the original motion; Ainsworth, YEA; Christensen, NAY; Hanson, YEA; Scott, YEA. Original motion adopted.

7. Report on the improvement of Crystal Lake relative to the construction of a dike to be placed from the sandpoint at the

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south end of Crystal Lake to the west bank. Commissioner Christensen moved that the Engineering Department be instructed to immediately cease further pumping of sand into the east dike and to proceed with the installation of the dike from the sand-point to the west shore. Voting on the motion: Ainsworth, YEA; Christensen, YEA; Hanson, NAY; Scott, NAY. Motion not adopted. Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, to send a copy of the report to the City Council and Park Board of the City of Robbinsdale and the Robbinsdale Post. Unanimously carried. ✓

8. Recommending that the resolution adopted by the Board July 12, 1949 for the improvement of a township road in Independence Township, be amended and that the sum of \$3000.00 be appropriated to the Township of Independence and the said Township to improve the road.

Commissioner Scott moved that the contractor and representatives from the Town Board of Independence be requested to appear before the Board at their next Board meeting to discuss the matter. Unanimously carried.

A letter from the Village of Hopkins enclosing a copy of a resolution objecting to the establishment of a Hennepin County Health Department, was read and ordered placed on file.

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Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Dr. F. J. Hill, health officer for the City of Minneapolis, reports that Frank J. Kunkle, 204 North Second Street, Minneapolis, is afflicted with tuberculosis in the infectious stage;

WHEREAS, It appears to this Board that each such parcel has been benefited by said public improvement in an amount equal to the amount set opposite each such parcel in said resolution and certificate;

NOW, THEREFORE, This Board does hereby determine that the value of each parcel of tax forfeited land described in said resolution and certificate and also described in the list hereinafter referred to was enhanced by such improvement to the extent of the amount set opposite each parcel

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in said resolution, certificate, and list, and that such amount should be added as a separate item to the existing appraised value of each such parcel; and

Charles R. Erickson and William O. Nilsen represented School District No. 7 and J. E. Snyder, Superintendent of Schools at Wayzata, and Don Quay represented School District No. 144.

Commissioner Christensen offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the County Superintendent of Schools of Hennepin County filed his Order and Amended Order with the County Auditor of said county on March 22, 1949 and August 5, 1949, respectively, disclosing: That the Hennepin County School Survey Committee filed its final report recommending the consolidation by reorganization (pursuant to Laws 1947, Chapter 421) of Common School District No. 98, Independent School District 128, Independent Joint School District No. 58-9, Common Joint School District No. 59-10, Tonka Bay Independent School District and Common School District No. 53, except that part of the territory of said District No. 53 embracing the lands lying in Government Lots 3 and 4 in Section 8, Township 117, Range 22, said Hennepin County; that at an election held on March 15, 1949, the recommendation of said School Survey Committee was adopted and that the territory of the above named school districts, except said Government Lots 3 and 4, is now consolidated into a school district known as Consolidated School District No. 7; and,

WHEREAS, at its meeting held on August 30, 1949, this Board adopted a resolution attaching and annexing to adjoining school districts, all the territory remaining in said Common School District No. 53, as follows:

To Consolidated School District No. 7: All that part of Government Lot 3 lying Westerly of Gray's Bay, Lake Minnetonka and Westerly of Minnehaha Creek, in Sec. 8, Twp. 117, Rg. 22.

To Independent School District No. 144: All that part of Government Lot 3 lying Easterly of Gray's Bay, Lake Minnetonka, and Easterly of Minnehaha Creek, and

Government Lot 4, in Sec. 8, Twp. 117, Rg. 22;
and continued to this 15th day of September 1949, the matter of the
division and apportionment of the assets and obligations (other than
bonded debt) of said District No. 53; and,

WHEREAS, this Board, after hearing all persons interested and
desiring to be heard, and having considered the nature and amount of
the assets and obligations of said Common School District No. 53,
finds as facts:

1. That the assessed valuation of the taxable property within
the territory which comprised Common School District No. 53, prior
to the effective date of said consolidation and annexation above
referred to, was \$740,469.00; and that the assessed valuation of
that part of said schooldistrict annexed to Independent District
No. 144 is \$12,098.00.
2. That the assets of Common School District No. 53, both real
and personal, as of March 15, 1949, were, to wit: certain school
equipment and supplies, a school building, school site and playgrounds;
that said assets are valued at, and reasonably worth the sum of
\$147,000.00. In addition thereto said school district had funds in
its school treasury in the sum of \$25,731.44.
3. That the School Board of said District No. 53 continued to
function as such School Board until June 30, 1949.
4. That on June 2, 1949, in making distribution of funds (as of
the last day of February, 1949) authorized by M.S.A. Section 276.10,
the County Auditor and County Treasurer paid to said Consolidated School
District No. 7 the funds in the County Treasury placed to the credit of
said School District No. 53, in the amount of \$10,574.17; and that
thereafter the officers of said consolidated district delivered and

paid said last mentioned sum of money to the Treasurer of School District No. 53.

5. That between March 15, 1949, and June 30, 1949, the said School Board of District No. 53 paid all the outstanding obligations of said district, other than bonded indebtedness; and that on said June 30, 1949, there remained in said school treasury funds in the sum of \$5,149.51.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED:

1. That said school equipment and supplies, the school building and real estate upon which it is situated, including said playgrounds, lying and being in Hennepin County, Minnesota, and described as follows, to-wit:

Lot 20 except the East 33 feet of the South 62 9/10 feet thereof, Lot 21 except the West 145 feet thereof and except the East 33 feet thereof, and all of Lots 22, 23 and 24 in The Herzog Deephaven Acres

be and the same are hereby assigned, transferred and awarded to Consolidated School District No. 7.

2. That the remaining funds mentioned above in Finding of Fact numbered 5, be and the same are hereby assigned, transferred and awarded as follows:

To Consolidated School District No. 7, the sum of \$ 2,663.39

To Independent School District No. 144, the sum of \$ 2,486.12

3. That all funds in the hands of the County Treasurer belonging to Common School District No. 53, and received and collected by said County Treasurer on and prior to May 31, 1949, be and the same are hereby apportioned and awarded as follows:

To Consolidated School District No. 7, a sum equal to 98.366% thereof
To Independent School District No. 144, a sum equal to 1.634% thereof

4. That the taxes collected by the County Treasurer on and after June 1, 1949 from the property located in the territory which comprised Common School District No. 53 prior to the Consolidation and annexation above mentioned, be apportioned in accordance with the location of the property from which the taxes are collected; that taxes so collected on the property within said territory, which through said consolidation and said annexation proceedings is now a part of Consolidated School District No. 7, be and the same are hereby awarded to said Consolidated School District No. 7; and that taxes so collected on property within said territory annexed and attached to Independent School District No. 144 be and the same are hereby awarded to said Independent School District No. 144.
