Tuesday, January 3, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson - - - First District

Commissioner George W. Matthews - - Second District

Commissioner Jens Christensen - - - Third District

Commissioner I. G. Scott - - - - Fourth District

Commissioner S. Earl Ainsworth - - Fifth District

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, and unanimously carried, that the Board proceed to vote by secret ballot for the selection of a chairman and a vice-chairman for the ensuing year. Mr. Fitzsimmons named Erick J. Jensen, Associate Highway Engineer, and T. J. Thompson, Clerk to the Board, to act as for Chairman tellers. Commissioner Matthews received four votes/and one ballot was blank. Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Matthews elected Chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1950. On the ballot for the vice-chairman, Commissioner Ainsworth received three votes, Commissioner Hanson received one vote, and one ballot was blank. Chairman Matthews declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected Vice-

Chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1950.

Commissioner Matthews announced that the committees appointed for the year 1949 would hold over during the year 1950.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the Board proceeded to open bids as follows:

For publishing the proceedings of the County Board of Hennepin County, Minnesota, for the year 1950, submitted by Credit Publishing Company for publishing said proceedings in Finance and Commerce at \$1.20 per folio for the first insertion, \$.60 per folio for each subsequent insertion of same, and \$.40 per folio additional for all tabular matter; also to furnish without additional cost to the County of Hennepin forty-five copies of each daily issue of said Finance and Commerce, and to furnish 25 bound copies of said proceedings in size, quality of paper, style of binding, etc. substantially conforming with the 1948 volume for \$2.05 per printed page.

For publishing the proceedings of the County Board of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, for the year 1950, outside the County seat, submitted by H. W. Schultz, Partner, for publication in The Osseo Press, at \$1.20 per folio and \$.40 additional per folio for all tabular matter.

For publishing the real estate Delinquent Tax List of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, for the taxes for 1948, submitted by Credit Publishing Company for publishing in Finance and Commerce, at \$.45 per description; also to furnish without additional cost to the County of Hennepin, 100 copies of each publication.

For publishing the Financial Statement of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, for the year 1949, submitted by Credit Publishing Company in Finance and Commerce, at \$1.20 per folio, and \$.40 per folio additional for all tabular matter for said publication; also to furnish without additional cost to the County of Hennepin 100 copies of said publication.

For publishing the Financial Statement of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, for the year 1949, in another section of the county than wherein the official newspaper is published. No bid.

The above bids were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

For furnishing to Hennepin County for the County Auditor's office one new cash register:

The bid of National Cash Register Company being the only bid received, the Clerk to the Board was directed to return it to the bidder unopened, and Robert F.Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was directed to readvertise for bids for said cash register.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of December 31, 1949, was received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Monthly and annual reports from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, and an annual report from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, were received and ordered placed on file.

An application for licenses to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Russell R. Heim, M.D., County Coroner, requesting the purchase of a new morgue ambulance as per specifications attached, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and Engineer.

An advance notice of the State Convention of County Commissioners was received and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Long & Thorshov, Inc., Architects for the Welfare Addition to the Court House and for the Radio Station Building as follows:

- 1. Relative to plaster cracks at the juncture of all old and new walls. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Recommending additions and deductions to the Kraus-Anderson Inc. contract. Referred to the Chairman of the Board.
- 3. Submitting copy of diagram showing the basement floor plan and the variation of floor levels at the Radio Station Building.

 Referred to the Engineer with a request thathe take levels at the building.

A bid from W. C. Klaffke for two three-quarters beds complete with pillows, blankets, springs and mattresses was read and the Clerk to the Board was requested to notify Mr. Klaffke that only the beds, springs, and mattresses had been scrapped.

A letter from H. M. Hanson relative to the laying-off of various Road and Lake employees on December 29, 1949 was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee Meeting on January 3, 1950, at 3:00 o'clock P.M.

A letter from W. W. Heffelfinger, former County Commissioner, extending his best wishes for the new year to his former associates and the employees in the Commissioners' office and challenging the boys to a golf game next summer, was read and the Clerk to the Board

was requested to acknowledge receipt of the challenge.

A letter from the Tower Town Transportation Company submitting copy of a law providing for federal aid to local school agencies for children residing on federal reservations was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board and the Attorney.

A letter from Carroll G. Patton, Examiner of Titles, requesting a ruling as to the amount of time allowed for sick leave to clerical employees was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board and the Attorney.

A notice of application for permit by Northern States Power Company to construct a transmission line over and along the banks of the Mississippi River was read and referred to the Engineer.

A copy of a letter from Waldron W. Douglas, Superintendent of the Home School for Boys, to the Minnetonka Motor Express relative to damages caused by one of the company trucks pulling down four telephone poles was read and referred to the Attorney. Commissioner <u>Christenses</u> offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the County Auditor and the Land Commissioner be and they hereby are directed to lease vacant and unoccupied lots or parcels of forfeited tax delinquent lands in this County for garden purposes during the season of 1950 to persons who do not intend to commercialize the products raised thereon; such leases to be subject to sale and to the right of the County Board to terminate same at any time, and also subject to all of the applicable provisions of Chapter 627, Laws 1943; leases to be granted upon the condition that the lessees shall keep the lots and parcels free from noxious and other weeds; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That each person who had a permit to use one of said lots or parcels of land for garden purposes during the season of 1949 shall be entitled to a lease on the same lot or parcel of land for use for garden purposes during the season of 1950, provided such lot or parcel has not been sold or otherwise leased, and provided further that such person shall make application therefor to the Land Commissioner on or before February 15, 1950.
