Tuesday, February 14, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment. All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of January 31, 1950, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and A. C. Ekelund, Superintendent of the County Home, were ordered placed on file.

Order No. 19936 from the Commissioner of State Highways ^{of a part} revoking the designation of State Aid Road No. 8 was received and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Department of the Army, Office of the Assistant Secretary, relative to the curtailment of demilitarization activities at the Twin Cities Arsenal Plant due to lack of funds was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, as follows:

1. Requesting approval of the amount of insurance for a Moneys and Securities policy for his office.

2. Requesting approval of the exchange of county depository securities held by Fourth Northwestern National Bank.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An inspection report was received from Long & Thorshov, Inc., Architects for the Welfare Addition to the Court House, and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Waldron W. Douglas, Superintendent of the Home School for Boys, requesting the purchase of a small parcel of land behind the Administration Building was read and referred to the Committee on County Homes.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board, submitting an easement from the County of Hennepin conveying a strip of land 30 feet wide along the West line of the Fairgrounds property to the City of Hopkins was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

An offer from W.C. Klaffke for the purchase of used beds, springs, and mattresses in the Jury rooms was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., the Board proceeded to consider the petitions of Eric H. Broman and Wm. P. Koeneman asking that their lands be set off from School District No. 51 to School District No. 24, which hearings had been continued from the meeting of February 7th. A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, was read, stating that the Board could not make a provision in its order granting the petitions of freeholders for School District set-offs which would have the legal effect of charging the lands with a proportionate share

of the existing bonded indebtedness of the district to which the lands are annexed. Mr. Koeneman again spoke on behalf of his petition. Mr. Bossert, Chairman of School District No. 24, stated that his district had no objections to the granting of the petitions. The whole matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A notice of application for permit by the Northern States Power Company from the Corps of Engineers, U.S. Army, to construct a transmission line tower at Minneapolis on the right bank of the Mississippi River about 1.9 miles up stream from St. Anthony Falls was received.

Commissioner Scott moved that the County Board oppose the construction of the transmission line tower.



The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly and biennial reports from the Public Health Nursing Service, and monthly reports from the County Extension Agent, County Home, and Sheriff were received and ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from E.H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Recommending the addition of special assessments to the appraised valuation of tax forfeited lands described in attached Special Assessment List No. 42.
2. Recommending the withholding from sale of the tax forfeited lands described in attached List "308-WH".
3. Recommending the transfer to the Village of Edina of the tax

forfeited lands described in attached List "309-T".

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter of resignation from Sarah Johansson, a Rural Public Health Nurse, was received, unanimously accepted, and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Dr. F. J. Hill, Commissioner of Health for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium, was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

3. Recommending approval of the revision of the County Road system in Eden Prairie township. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee meeting on Monday, March 27th.

A letter from Howard R. Hush, Chief Probation Officer, requesting the purchase of a new automobile for his department was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and Engineer for specifications.

A notice of application for permit by the Northern States Power Company was received from the Corps of Engineers, U.S. Army, requesting permission to construct a temporary overhead wire crossing over the Minnesota River was read and referred to the County Engineer.

A form of contract between the County of Hennepin and the City of Minneapolis for fire protection of County-owned buildings was presented by Chairman Matthews and referred to Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board.

Commissioner Christensen offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Minneapolis in the County of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, on the 10th day of March, 1950, duly adopted a resolution determining the total amount which would have been assessed against each parcel of tax forfeited land therein described for improving Penn Avenue North from the South line of Englewood, Hennepin County, Minnesota to 49th Avenue North, and others, by grading and surfacing, sewers, water main, curb and gutter, and sidewalk, if such parcels of land had been subject to assessment, which said public improvement was made by said city after each such parcel had been forfeited to the State for non-payment of taxes; and
