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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 4, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of March 31, 1950, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, A. C. Ekelund, Superintendent of the County Home, and Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, were received and ordered placed on file.

Specifications were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

- 1. For tar for highway purposes to be delivered at the local refinery and to be delivered at various stations.
 - 2. For chemicals for weed eradication.

The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A petition requesting the Village Council of Golden Valley to vacate all alleys in Block 8 Lakeview Heights, on which property the radio station building is located, was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The plat of Farr Addition was received and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, relative to the application of Metalloy Corporation of St. Louis Park for a reduction of valuation on personal property, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Dr. F. J. Hill, Commissioner of Health for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Minneapolis Housing and Redevelopment
Authority requesting the withholding from sale of State lands in
public housing sites was read and referred to the Committee on Public
Grounds and Buildings and Land Commissioner.

A petition signed by Fred Gast and others requesting the improvement of County Highway No. 94 between Lyndale on the Minneapolis-Watertown Road and U.S. Highway No. 12 was read and referred to the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee and Engineer.

A petition signed by Herbert J. Paulson and others requesting the County to take over and grade the township road between County Road No. 4 and State Highway No. 101 was read and referred to the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Ethel Crane requesting the improvement of County Road No. 5 was read and referred to the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee and Engineer.

A report from George W. Matthews, Chairman of the Board, on his attendance at the National Rivers and Harbors Conference in Washington, D.C. was presented and ordered placed on file. Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, It is necessary and common practice in the corporate limits of cities and villages to place public utilities in the traveled portion of streets, and

WHEREAS, The connections to these public utilities are frequently made by digging trenches across the streets, and

WHEREAS, It is difficult to control the methods of excavation and backfill of such trenches, and

WHEREAS, The public use of the street is interfered with and the use becomes hazardous due to lack of proper maintenance of the backfilled trenches,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That on any County Road lying within the corporate limits of a city or village in Hennepin County, the village or city council will be held responsible for any openings made in the surface of a street which is designated as a county or state aid road and shall require those authorized to make public utility connections to do the work in such a manner as to do a minimum of damage to the road surface and properly tamp and compact the backfill material so that a minimum of settlement will result, and to replace the surface in as nearly the same condition as it was before the work was started. Also, in the case of a village or city council entering into a contract for the placing of a public utility, that the specifications shall require that the contractor furnish a bond running to the county guaranteeing the replacement and repair of the surface of the highway in a manner satisfactory to the County Engineer of Hennepin County.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 11, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from E.H.Larson, Land Commissioners, as follows:

- 1. Requesting authority to wreck a building partially destroyed by fire.
- 2. Recommending the addition of special assessments to the appraised valuations of tax forfeited lands described in attached Special Assessment List No. 43.
- 3. Recommending the withdrawal from sale of the tax forfeited lands described in attached List "310-W".

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Petitions were received from William A. and Florence A. Thotland asking that their lands be set off from School District No. 89 to School District No. 24, and from the Golden Oaks Company asking that certain lands owned by it be set off from School District No. 24 to School District No. 138. The above petitions were referred to Robert E. Scott, County Superintendent of Schools.

A letter from Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey submitting remarks made by him on the floor of the Senate March 21, 1950, relative to the Natural Gas Bill, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Minneapolis Memorial Day Association enclosing copy of letter of application from the Minneapolis Detachment--Marine Corps League, Inc. for membership in the Minneapolis Memorial Day Association, making that organization eligible to receive an appropriation from Hennepin County for Memorial Day exercises, was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from the State Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Food, calling attention to the Annual Plant Industry Conference to be held in the Mayor's reception room on April 12th at 9:30 o'clock A.M., was read and ordered placed on file.

Specifications were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

- 1. For an automobile for the Highway Department.
- 2. For two trucks with dump boxes for the Highway Department.
- 3. For screening, crushing, stock piling and/or loading into trucks approximately 60,000 cubic yards of gravel for road purposes. The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee

meeting on Monday, April 17, 1950, at 1:30 o'clock P.M.

A letter from Ben Rose requesting a survey of his property on Lake Minnetonka for possible dredging and filling in of a swampy area was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee and Engineer.

A letter from Parker S. Nolan, President, Local No. 9, Minneapolis City and County Employees, relative to a unified policy of holidays, sick leave, and vacations for employees at the County Home and Home School for Boys was read and referred to Commissioner Hanson, Chairman of the Committee on County Homes.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board, addressed to John C. Sheehan, Appraiser in the Forfeited Land Department, relative to the purchase of equipment was read and ordered placed on file.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the Board called for bids for furnishing a new automobile to Hennepin County for the Probation Office. The bid of the Bob Knowles Ford Company being the only one received, the Board ordered it returned unopened to the bidder and directed that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, readvertise for bids for said automobile, bids to be opened on Tuesday, April 25, 1950, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A Board of Audit report showing the cash and bank balances of the County Treasurer at the close of business April 3, 1950 was received and ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Letters were received from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

 - 3. Submitting a list limiting the expenditures for the cutting

A resolution from the Cecil Kyle Post A.L. #425, requesting the release of all lots withdrawn from sale in North Minneapolis, was read and ordered placed on file.

Resolution No. 354 from the City Council of Robbinsdale requesting the appropriation of \$40,000.00 to the Crystal Lake Improvement Project to complete the dredging and shoreline work in accordance with the original plans was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the City of Minneapolis Engineering Department requesting the cutting of weeds and the posting of "No Dumping" signs on Lot 7, Block 2, Radisson Park Addition, being a tax forfeited lot, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings, and Attorney.
