Minneapolis, Minnesota Wednesday, July 5, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Funds as of June 30, 1950, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the minutes of the Board and placed on file.

A copy of a letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, to Mr. Anson Mase authorizing the Lake Minnetonka Dredging Co. to install speed control signs in the channel running West from Gideon's Bay was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Dr. F. J. Hill, Minneapolis Health Commissioner, requesting the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt beverage

and to sell cigarettes were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, as follows:

- 1. Relative to a boat launching platform at Gray's Bay.
- 2. Relative to the authority of the County Board to grant permission to the City of Hopkins to use a portion of the County Home land for a playground.

Said letters were referred to Commissioner Ainsworth, Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee.

Three letters received from Edward J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, with attached papers relative to highway easements were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter relative to the Crystal Lake Dredging project received from the Minnesota Emergency Conservation Committee, signed by Charles Chairman, and L. Horn/by O. L. Kaupanger, Secretary, was referred to Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board.

Mr. Kaupanger addressed the Board objecting to the present form of the Crystal Lake Dredging Project specifications. Eric Jensen, Assistant County Engineer, replied to Mr. Kaupanger. Mr. F. A. Raven also addressed the Board and questioned Mr. Jensen in regard to the technical details of the specifications, stating that said specifications were not definite enough in showing the amount of material to be removed from the lake bottom. Mr. Joe Johnson also spoke, urging the early completion of the Crystal Lake Dredging project.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the Board proceeded to open bids as follows:

Highway Engineer a right-of-way map of said project detailing the
various parcels of land, numbered 1 to 25 inclusive, which are necessary
for the purposes herein mentioned; and

WHEREAS, easements in and to all of said parcels of land except parcels numbered 7, 8, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 19A have been heretofore acquired by the county by purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That all the parcels of land designated on said right-of-way map are necessary and requisite for said road purposes and that it is necessary that an easement in and to the lands designated on said plat as parcels numbered 7, 8, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 19A be acquired by said county by condemnation; and that the county in said condemnation proceedings acquire the following rights: To erect temporary snow fences upon said lands and upon the lands adjacent thereto; to construct slopes on said lands to be taken for that purpose as designated on said right-of-way map; and to take and acquire all trees, shrubs, grass and herbage now existing and growing upon said lands and hereafter planted and grown thereon, and to have the exclusive control of the same; but no claim to any interest in and to any buildings and structures on said land is to be obtained by said county. That all buildings and

structures on any of said lands are to remain the property of the owners of said premises but are to be removed from the lands taken for said road purposes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of said right-of-way map be filed with the Clerk of the District Court of Hennepin County as soon as practicable after the filing of the initial petition in the condemnation proceedings herein directed.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 11, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and to sell nonintoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A plat of McAndrews Second Addition, located in the Town of Bloomington, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A report from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Commissioners, relative to the specifications for dredging Crystal Lake was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from L. P.Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Recommending the awarding of contracts for corrugated metal

culverts on Project No. 5002-9. Ordered placed on file.

- 2. Recommending acceptance of the Armel Construction Company bid on Project No. 488, Improvement of Crystal Lake. Referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.
- 3. A report on the drainage condition of the John Havlik property on Trunk Highway No. 1 approximately one mile North of the junction with Trunk Highway No. 7, previously referred to Mr. Zimmerman on June 20, 1950. Ordered placed on file.

A second petition received from Helen M. Seiler asking that her lands be set off from School District No. 7 (Joint) to School District No. 141 was referred to Frank J.Williams, Attorney for the County Board.

Specifications for recoller shelf cases for the office of the Register of Deeds, with letter from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

According to reliable estimates, there are approximately 115,000 cubic yards of material to be removed and inasmuch as the capacity of the dredge specified is less than 100 cubic yards per hour and the specifications call for 650 working hours, only 65,000 cubic yards will be moved this year, leaving 50,000 still to be moved. Accordingly, this project cannot be completed without appropriating an additional \$30,000,00.
- 4. If the total yardage to be excavated were let upon a cubic yard basis, other contractors would be interested in bidding.

WHEREAS: This is a repetition of the Amendment voted down by the voters of the State two years ago which proposed a 50 - 50 split of the income from gasoline tax as between the Trunk Highway Fund and the State Road and Bridge Fund, with the additional lure to the city vote of splitting the amount formerly proposed to go to the State Road and Bridge Fund between the counties 44% and the cities of 100,000 or more population 6% and

WHEREAS: The same objection to the proposal exists that existed two years ago, namely, that the State Trunk Highway Fund is being raided for the purpose of diverting gas tax revenues to other than road purposes by the method of substitution of gas tax funds for county tax levy funds, and

WHEREAS: Hennepin County is still limited by the State Constitution to a maximum of 3% of the county's gas tax share so that additional gas tax revenue appropriation for county purposes means only that Hennepin County is paying many times more in amount paid for gas tax than they can possibly receive back through any split as long as the 3% ceiling prevails, and

WHEREAS: Hennepin County is now paying nearly 25% of the Minnesota road bill and will, if the Amendment passes, further subsidize the financing of the construction of the county roads in the State of Minnesota, and

WHERMAS: If the Amendment is passed, the State Trunk Highway Fund will be reduced so that the State will be unable to match available federal funds and an increase in the gas tax bill will be necessary to accomplish this matching,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That this, the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, go on record opposing the proposal set forth in the Constitutional Amendment, and
