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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 15, 1950

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, Public Health Nursing Service and A. C. Ecklund, Superintendent of the County Home, were received and ordered placed on file.

Applications for licenses to sell cigarettes were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Mens.

A notice of hearing before the Railroad and Warehouse Commission on the application of the Twin City Motor Bus Company for adjustment of rates was read and referred to L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer.

Letters were received from George A. Totten, Jr., County
Treasurer as follows:

- 1. Requesting purchase of racks for tax record books and files for real estate tax statement forms, and was referred to the Engineer and Treasurer for specifications.
- 2. Requesting approval for exchange of collateral securities of the Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis; referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Dr. F. J. Hill, Commissioner of Health in the City

of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, recommending that bids received for bituminous surfacing on county roads No. 49 and No. 121, be rejected, was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee meeting on Monday, August 21st at 11 o'clock a.m.

A maintenance agreement for electric typewriter equipment from the I.B.M. Corporation for the Court Commissioner was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Greater Lake Minnetonka Council, Inc., submitting a list of recommendations relative to dredging operations at Lake Minnetonka, was read and referred to the Chairman of the Road and Lake Committee and the County Highway Engineer.

Judge D. E. LaBelle appeared before the Board relative to the Home School for Girls budget and opposed the commitment of girls to Sauk Centre. The Judge and members of the Board discussed the possibility of moving the home to some other location. The matter was referred to a committee of the judges and members of the County Board. The vote on approving the budget was as follows:

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A Contract and Contract Bond from the Lake Minnetonka Dredging Company for dredging and miscellaneous improvement of Lake Minnetonka was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A request from F. J. Hill, Commissioner of Health of the City of Minneapolis for the commitment of a patient to the Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, for tax receipt drawer case and roller shelves case for the County Treasurer's office was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A claim from McLeod County for costs incurred in the case of the State of Minnesota versus Rubin Shetsky was presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means. A letter from the Hopkins Fire Department requesting use of the Hennepin County Fair Grounds for the annual fire school of the United Fire Fighters Association was read and referred to Commissioner Ainsworth.
