Wednesday, February 14, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports from Harold C. Pederson, County Extension Agent, and from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, were ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, as follows:

- 1. Reporting on action taken by the Hennepin Senate Delegation on Hennepin County bills.
- 2. Reporting on a letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting authorization for membership in the Municipal Finance Officers' Association.

The above letters were ordered placed on file.

A notice from the Department of Agriculture, Dairy and Food of the Annual Plant Industry Conference on weeds, seeds, etc. to be held at the Y,M.C.A. on February 16th beginning at 9:30 o'clock A.M., was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, requesting permission to dispose of used cabinets in his office was read and referred to the Chairman of the County Board.

A letter from Dr. F. J. Hill, City Health Commissioner, requesting the commitment of a petient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the withdrawal from sale, division-combination, classification, and reclassification of certain tax forfeited lands was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from the Committee on New Contract relative to the proposed new contract for supplying current for pumping water at Lake Minnetonka was read. Commissioner Hanson moved thatthe Northern States Power Company be asked to revise the contract submitted so that if at any time within the life of the contract it is desired by the County to place one or more trial diesel installations, it will be able to do so without violating the contract. Unanimously carried.

A letter from the Great American Indemnity Company of New York inquiring whether an annual bid bond could be filed with the County instead of submitting a certified check or separate bid bond with each bid was read and referred to the legal department for a written opinion.

A letter from the City of Hopkins submitting a resolution adopted by the Council of the City of Hopkins requesting the Hennepin County Board to sell property adjacent to the County Home was read and the matter was laid over until Commissioner Ainsworth returns to the City.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, requesting the amending of the resolution adopted by the County Board February 7, 1950, designating certain streets and avenues in the City of Minneapolis as State Aid Roads was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

An application by the City of Minneapolis requesting that the taxes for the year 1950 upon real estate owned by the city in the Village of Morningside be abated and cancelled and that the real estate be placed upon the tax exempt rolls was presented and referred to the Legal Department Civil.
