Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 3, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of March 31, 1951, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell cigarettes and non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- a. Recommending the repurchase of certain tax forfeited lands by Parker's Lake Cemetery Association.
 - b. Recommending approval of the transfer of certain tax

forfeited lands to the Village of Richfield for street purposes.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Agreements for maintenance of electric typewriters in the office of the Register of Deeds were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Walter P. Quist, Chairman, Board of Governors, Big Island Veterans' Camp, requesting an appropriation for the year 1952 was read and referred to the Accounting Department of the County Auditor's Office.

Specifications for the purchase of tires and tubes for the Highway Department were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Waldron W. Douglas, Superintendent of the Home School for Boys, relative to the lake level of Glen Lake, was read and referred to L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, with a direction that he follow out Mr. Douglas's request.

A letter from the Brotherhood of Painters, Paperhangers, and Decorators, relative to wage scales, with copy of the stipulation for amendment attached, was read and referred to L.P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., Mr. Chard, of the State Highway Department, proceeded to open bids for the grading and paving of State Aid Road No. 7. The bids were referred to Mr. Chard and L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 10, 1951

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, with letter from the City of Robbinsdale attached, requesting an additional radio equipped police car for the City of Robbinsdale was read.
