Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 26, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A report for the month of May received from County Agricultural Agent George G. Roadfeldt was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the County Agricultural Agent, with attached certificate of status of the Hennepin County Farm Bureau Association and copy of the resolution adopted by the County Co-Operative Extension Committee approving the budget for the year 1952 submitted by County Agent Roadfeldt, and the said budget were presented to the County Board. A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, and unanimously carried, to place the requested sum of \$8705.00 in the County Agricultural Extension Service budget for the year 1952.

A letter from Bert H. Ostlund, Quartermaster of the Russell Gaylord Post #159, V.F.W., reporting on Memorial Day expenditures was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Margaret Mary McGuire, Chairman, Steering Committee, thanking the Board members for their help in making a success of

Public Servants Week was read and ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from W. L. Hursh objecting to the issuance of a license to Maxwell Dunn, or any other person, to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor in the Town of Orono on the premises described as the West 200 feet of the East 800 feet of that part of Government Lot 3, Sec. 35, T. 118, R. 23, which lies north of the center line of Trunk Highway No. 12, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from the Chairman, Clerk, and Treasurer of the Board of Education, Eagle Lake School District No. 129, Hennepin County, notifying the County Board of the adoption by the legal voters of said School District of a resolution requesting the County Commissioners to take the necessary action to dissolve said school district was read and referred to the County Attorney, together with a letter from the Clerk of Independent School District No. 43 stating the willingness of the Board of Education of said School District No. 43 to accept said School District No. 129, if dissolved, as a part of said School District No. 43.

A letter from Wallace I. Peterson, Deputy Village Clerk of the Village of Buffalo, Minnesota, addressed to Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and three copies of a police radio service agreement signed by the Mayor and the Village Clerk of the Village of Buffalo, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hanson, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, and unanimously carried, that Chairman Matthews be authorized to meet with the Police Committee of the City Council of the

City of Minneapolis, to discuss rates for Municipal Police Radio Station services.

A motion was made and duly seconded that \$1,000.00 be appropriated from the Emergency Fund to the Blue Printing Department for the purchase of materials for aerial maps of Hennepin County. On the vote on the motion there were five YEAS and no NAYS, as follows:

Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, addressed the Board requesting partial payment to the Mark Hurd Mapping Company on their contract for furnishing aerial maps to Hennepin County. A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, duly seconded, and carried, to refer the matter to Frank J.Williams, Attorney for the County Board.

A letter received from Russell M. Lockwood, Chairman, representing the Gravel Haulers of Hennepin County, requesting an increase of one cent per yard mile over the present rate, was read to the Board. A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Scott, and unanimously carried, to grant the request.

Mr. John Nordin, State Representative, and Mr. E. S. Vevea, County Engineer of Anoka County, appeared before the Board suggesting that funds be appropriated in the 1952 budget for improving the East River Road. A motion was made by Commissioner Hanson, duly seconded, and carried, that Mr. L. P. Zimmerman, Hennepin County Engineer, confer

with Mr. Vevea relative to improvements on East River Road, also known as S.A.R. No. 1, Anoka County.

The continued hearing called for 10:30 o'clock A.M., on the Florence M. Hengen encroachment on County Road No. 7, on motion duly carried, was again continued, hearing being set for July 3, 1951, at 10:30 o'clock A.M.

A letter from Frank J.Williams, Attorney for the County Commissioners, recommending the rescinding of the action taken by the County Board at its June 20, 1951 meeting accepting the bid of Anderson and Sons, Inc. for the grading and concrete paving onS.A.R. No. 5, County Project No. 5012, was read and referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tax Forfeited Land Department of Hennepin County that a dangerous condition exists on one of the tax forfeited lots located on the southeast corner of Buchanan Street N.E. and 12th Avenue N.E. described as follows: All of Lot 3 and the South 82 5/10 ft of Lot 2 except R.R. right of way, Block 3, Cummings 2nd Addition to Minneapolis; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to remove this condition to prevent an accident and injuries to anyone;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Engineer prepare an estimate of cost for grading and levelling said lot. Said estimate to include cost of removing the old limestone foundation and other stone or brick material.

WHEREAS, it is proposed by the county of Hennepin and the village of St. Louis Park to grade and surface State Aid Road No. 5, also known as Minnetonka Boulevard between Joppa Avenue and Trunk Highway No. 100 in the Village of St. Louis Park with a 44-foot wide, 8-inch minimum thickness Portland cement concrete paving; and

WINTEREAS, the plan for such improvement involves a higher surface type and greater, than would be necessary to accommodate the normal rural traffic on said road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this board agrees to enter into a contract with the village of St. Louis Park for the construction of said project by the terms of which the cost thereof shall be paid one-half by each the county and the village; that the work of construction be carried out by the village; that the work shall be done under the supervision of the county highway engineer; that the contract forconstruction shall provide that the county shall be liable to the contractor for one-half of the total payments to be made on said contract and that the village shall be liable for one-half the total payments to be made thereon; that the contract for construction shall provide that payments shall be made by the village and county to the contractor as follows:

Estimates issued by the engineer for payments on this contract shall be made in duplicate, one for the village and one for the county, and on each estimate the engineer shall state the amount to be paid by the village and the amount to be paid by the county, which amounts shall be their proportionate parts of the total to be paid by each hereunder; and payments thereof shall be made by the village and the county accordingly and in accordance with the terms of this agreement, and the provisions of law applicable thereto.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 10, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board, submitting a form of easement between the County of Hennepin and Minneapolis-Moline Company for the purpose of constructing a storm sewer over and across County-owned property was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Mr. O. A. Pearson recommending the employment of Margaret E. Lockhart as secretary in the office of the Budget and Purchasing Agent was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

Letters were received from the Public Health Nursing Department as follows:

- 1. Recommending the employment of a staff nurse.
- 2. Recommending change of classification for Edna Eidem, Record Clerk, from Class 3 to Class 4A.
- 3. Recommending an increase in salary for Louella Wiebe, Record Clerk.

All of the above letters were referred to the Public Health Nursing Committee.

A letter from Philip C. Schmidt, Clerk of District Court, recommending acceptance of the bid of Miller-Davis Company for office furniture was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the withdrawal from sale of lands described in attached List "330-W" and the improvement of certain tax forfeited lands, with recommendations from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, attached, were read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from E. W. Bolmgren, Division Engineer of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company, requesting 3000 cu. yds. of fill at five cents per cu. yd. from the Hennepin County Farm hill in Hopkins was read. Mr. Zimmerman, County Engineer, was requested to reply to the communication and to prepare a proper resolution authorizing the fill, the railroad company to pay for supervision of taking the fill.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 24, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Hanson, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Christensen.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, and Robert E. Scott, Superintendent of Schools, relative to the petitions of Evelyn Gendreau and Alene M. Greene asking that their lands be set off from School District No. 31 to School District No. 34 were read

and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A report of the Animal Rescue League for the year 1950 and a letter relative to the increase in the League's 1952 budget request were received and referred to the Legal Department Civil.

The Municipal Building Commission budget for 1952 was presented and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the addition of various street in the City of Minneapolis to the State Aid Road system. Ordered placed on file.
