Tuesday, August 7, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of July 31, 1951, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting the official preliminary report of L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, for the improvement of County Ditch No. 18 and setting a date of hearing thereon was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

1. Reporting on the petition for the improvement of France

Avenue between 27th and 28th Streets. Ordered placed on file.

2. Reporting on the claim of Ernest and Mae McGowan wherein they allege that the County highway department trespassed upon the McGowan property by taking away the lateral support therefrom. Referred to the Legal Department Civil.

A letter from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending that special assessments be added to the appraised valuation of certain tax forfeited lands was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

John W. Windhorst, attorney representing the Independent Press, appeared before the Board relative to personal property tax judgments against his client and asked that the Board cancel taxes, penalties, and interest on the application of said Independent Press that are covered by the Statute of Limitations. Mr. Windhorst also offered an additional \$500.00 on behalf of his client for the settlement of the tax judgments in question. Mr. Windhorst was referred to Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor.

Sheriff Ed Ryan appeared before the Board relative to the collection of delinquent personal property taxes and asked that the Board bring to the attention of the Interim Committee of the State Legislature the limited time in which the sheriff must act in collecting delinquent personal property taxes and request an extension of 30 days in the time within which he must act. Sheriff Ryan also called the Board's attention to the need for additional funds for the collection of these taxes. Mr. Shannon advised that the sheriff should take up the matter of additional funds with the Salary and Classification Commission.

A letter from C. F. Haglin, Chairman of the Lake Level Committee, Lake Minnetonka Councils, Inc., relative to the excessive height of the water in Lake Minnetonka was read and referred to the County Engineer.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., the matter of the dissolution and attachment of School District No. 129 (commonly called the Eagle Lake School District), came on for hearing pursuant to resolution of this Board adopted July 17, 1951. The Clerk to the Board presented the County Auditor's certificate of mailing notices to the clerks of School Districts No. 27, No. 43, No. 46, No. 123, and No. 129, the Sheriff's return of posting the required notices in each of said school districts, and the publisher's affidavit of publication of said notices. Elmer W. Lutz, Clerk of School District No. 129, was present at the hearing. A letter from Robert E. Scott, Superintendent of Hennepin County Schools, recommending that School District No. 129 be transferred to School District No. 43 was read. No one appeared in opposition to the proposed dissolution of School District No. 129 and its attachment to School District No. 43. The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., hearing was called on the cutting down of hedges and trees on State Aid Road No. 156. None of the abutting land owners, to whom notices had been mailed, appeared before the Board. A letter was read from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, notifying the Board that the owners of the property included in the notices had executed easements for sloping their property, including the removal of trees, and recommending that the proceedings be dismissed.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved that the recommendation of the engineer be accepted. Unanimously carried.

Commissioner Christensen from the Committee on Public Grounds and Building presented the following report:

WHEREAS, At a special meeting of School District No. 129⁵²
 (commonly called Eagle Lake School District), held on May 31, 1951,^{now 18-1952}
 a resolution to dissolve said district was adopted by a majority of
 the electors at said meeting, and a certificate of the Clerk of said
 School District No. 129 setting forth said resolution, and showing the⁵²
 result of the vote thereon was presented to the County Board^{this} of this
 County; and that by resolution adopted this 7th day of August, 1951,^{no. 10}
 said County Board dissolved said School District No. 129; and^{gan 52}

WHEREAS, By resolution adopted at its meeting held on July 17,^{now 25}
 1951¹⁹⁵¹, said County Board ordered that a hearing be had on the 7th day
 of August, 1951, at 10:20 o'clock A.M., in Committee Room 130 Court
 House, in the City of Minneapolis, in said County, for the purpose
 of determining to which existing school district or districts the
 territory comprising said School District No. 129 shall be attached
 in the event of dissolution thereof, and ordered that a notice of
 hearing be given as provided by law as in other cases of change of
 boundaries of school districts; and

WHEREAS, Said notice of the time and place of said hearing was
 duly given by posting a copy thereof in three public places in each
 of the school districts to be or which may be affected by these pro-
 ceedings, namely, School Districts No. 27, No. 43, No. 46, No. 123, and
 No. 129, ten days prior to the time of such hearing; and by mailing to the
 Clerk of each of the school districts above named a true and correct

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copy of said notice at least ten days prior to said hearing, and by publication of said notice for two weeks in the Finance and Commerce, a legal newspaper printed and published in said Hennepin County, which said newspaper has heretofore been designated by said County Board as the official paper of said County for the publication of the proceedings of said Board and the publication of all legal notices ordered published by the said Board; and that due proof of said posting, mailing, and publication have been filed with the County Auditor of said County; and

WHEREAS, At the time and place designated in said notice the said County Board heard all persons present and who desired to be heard in the matter of the attachment of said territory or any part thereof, and it was made to appear at said hearing that said School District No. 129 had no bonded debt and that it was the owner of certain real estate on which its school building is located, being described as follows:
