The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A. M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles was presented and ordered placed on file.

The report of the Public Examiner on the financial affairs of Hennepin County for the years ended December 31st, 1949 and 1950 was presented and ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by Mrs. Veronica H. Olson, asking that her land be set off from School District No. 31 to School District No. 34, was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the appraisal and leasing of a certain parcel of tax forfeited property was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting the transfer of funds from the emergency fund to the audit fund was read and referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Andrew Kohlan, Attorney, representing the petitioners for the establishment of a judicial road between Hennepin and Ramsey Counties appeared before the Board and asked that the Board re-consider its action of August 28th, opposing the establishment of the road. A

copy of a letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, to John Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, setting out his reasons for opposing the establishment of the road was read. The Board directed that a copy of Mr. Zimmerman's letter be sent to Mr. Kohlan. There was no further action on the matter by the Board.

Clyde Brown of the Village of Richfield appeared before the Board claiming excessive valuation by the Assessor of Richfield on his property. Mr. Brown was referred to Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments.

Commissioner Ainsworth offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A. M. pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of August 31st, 1951, was received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

An application for the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor was received and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Frank J. Williams with letter from Federal Barge Lines attached in which they offer to withdraw their claim against the County for delay in the opening of the Cedar Avenue Bridge was read. Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the offer be accepted. Unanimously carried.

A letter from the Public Health Nursing Service, recommending the employment of Mrs. Muriel M. Gould as a temporary staff nurse was read and referred to the Public Health Nursing Committee.

Specifications were received from L. P. Zimmermann, County Highway Engineer as follows:

- 1. For one electric multiple register budgetary accounting machine for the Budget and Purchasing Office. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
 - 2. For corrugated metal pipe. Referred to the Road and Lake

Committee.

A notice from the State Department of Conservation for permit authorizing rip rapping of the lake shore at Lake Minnetonka by Harvey B. Finch was presented and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner as follows:

- 1. Submitting a deed of reconveyance of tax forfeited land to the State of Minnesota by the City of Robbinsdale.
- 2. Submitting an application by the City of Robbinsdale for conveyance of certain tax forfeited land for public purposes.
- 3. Recommending the withdrawal from sale of certain tax forfeited property for reappraisal purposes.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from Senators Humphrey and Thye relative to the establishment of a Federal Airport at Anoka were read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from E. J. Shannon relative to the claim of Thor Thompson for damages to his property caused by paving of County Highway No. 7 was read and a copy of the letter ordered sent to the Attorneys, Wolner, Kelly & Haglund.

The plats of G. G. Palmer Addition and Soens Bloomington Addition were presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

The matter of a new heating plant at the Home School for Girls was referred to Commissioner Hanson.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer as follows:

- 1. Recommending the addition of two employees to the semimonthly payroll.
- 2. Relative to the purchase of truck and tractor tires and tubes.

The above letters were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from the Town of Orono, opposing the removal of the present Gray's Bay Dam or the building of a new dam below the present dam was read and ordered placed on file.
