The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Al Hanson, City Comptroller, and Mrs. O. I. Borton addressed the Board on behalf of the Board of Estimate and Taxation requesting a reduction in the levy for Glen Lake Sanatorium and the County Welfare budgets for 1952.

Dr. Frost, Superintendent of Glen Lake Sanatorium, appeared before the Board requesting that the maximum amount provided by law be levied for maintenance, construction, and equipment of Glen Lake Sanatorium. Dr. White, Miss Moen, Mr. Wright, Miss Roberts, and Parker Nolan addressed the Board in support of Dr. Frost's request.

Commissioner <u>Scott</u> offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, That there be and is hereby levied a tax on all taxable property of the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, for maintenance of the Glen Lake Sanatorium, Hennepin County, Minnesota, during the year 1952, of five mills on the assessed valuation of said county; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That there be and is hereby levied a tax on all taxable property of the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, for construction and equipment at Glen Lake Sanatorium, Hennepin County, Minnesota, during the year 1952, of 0.50 mills on the assessed valuation of said county.

Scott, County Superintendent of Schools, for transportation of pupils from school districts having no secondary schools to districts having classified secondary schools, and a report for tuition of resident pupils of school districts wherein no classified secondary schools are maintained were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the withdrawal from sale of lands described in attached List "333-W", the combination and division of lands described in attached List "333-DC", "333-DC1" and "333-DC2", and the classification of lands described in attached List "333-C1" was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Specifications were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, as follows:

- 1. For a new furnace at the Home School for Girls.
- 2. For furniture for the District Court.

The above specifications were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A request from Dr. F. J. Hill, City Health Commissioner, for the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Rural Public Health Nursing Service requesting

permission for Jeanette Vroom, Director, and Alma Hovde, Supervisor, to attend the American Public Health Association meeting at San Francisco, California, and asking that the balance of the funds for convention purposes be used for partial payment of the expenses incurred, wasread.

Commissioner Christensen moved that the request be denied.
