Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 1, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At 10:00 o'clock A.M., Mr. McCubrey of the State Highway Department proceeded to open bids for grading on State Project No. 27-535-01 (State Aid Road No. 9 and 50), submitted by the following bidders:

The above bids were referred to the Road and Lake Committee, L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, and Mr. McCubrey.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing to the Hennepin County Highway Department four 2-ton trucks with dump boxes and material for sectional plate or multi plate pipe arch culvert. Said bids were read aloud by Mr.

Pearson. The bids for trucks were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and the Purchasing Agent, and the bids for culvert material were referred to the Road and Lake Committee, L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, and O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent. Mr. Pearson stated that he would immediately file a signed tabulation of the bids with the County Auditor.

A letter from E. H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the Village of St. Louis Park for the transfer of the tax forfeited lands described in attached Transfer List "350-T" to said village was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A copy of a letter from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, to Ole Pearson, Budget Director and Purchasing Agent, requesting installation of air conditioning in his office, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Ole A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, submitting contracts and bonds from the Post Publishing Company for publishing the proceedings of the County Board for the year 1952 and the

Financial Statement of Hennepin County for the year 1951 in a newspaper published outside the County Seat, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A report on a meeting between Commissioners Ainsworth and Matthews, and Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, relating to assessing policies was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from E. C. Arnold of the Pistol Range Committee, reporting on the proposed pistol range to be located in the Village of Golden Valley was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Ole Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, recommending acceptance of the bids of Armco Drainage & Metal Products, Inc., H. V. Johnston Culvert Company, and Wheeling Corrugating Company for corrugated metal culverts was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from George C. Smith, Maple Plain, was ordered placed on file.

No. 134 was necessary in order to protect the footings of said Bridge
No. 27 over the Minnesota River at Savage from the possibility of
damage during the anticipated flood stage of the Minnesota River; and

WHEREAS, It was necessary to haul in crushed rock underneath the bridge and to place it around the mud sills to protect them from the type of damage that was done in the 1951 floods when material was washed away from the mud sills to the extent, in some instances, of leaving them hanging without support; and

WHEREAS, It was necessary that this work be commenced at once in order to utilize the frozen ground to get the hauling done over the roads before it is necessary to restrict them to load limits;

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 8, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A Statement of Balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of March 31, 1952, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from the State Department of Highways relative to the allocation by the State Board of Allotment of the State Road and Bridge fund for 1952, and also granting a special allotment for the reconstruction of S.A.R. No. 5 in the Village of St. Louis Park, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting approval for himself and the Chief Accountant to attend the annual

Convention of the Municipal Finance Officers' Association at Boston, Mass. was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board, relative to the matter of providing nursing care at the University

Hospital for a resident of the Village of St. Anthony was read and a copy of the letter was ordered sent to Andrew G. Kohlan, Attorney for said village.

A letter from Lief E. Johnson inquiring as to what steps the County intends taking with respect to the clearance of the flowage in Minnehaha Creek was read and referred to the Engineer and Lake Improvement Committee.

A report on assessing procedures in rural Hennepin County received from Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, and a copy of a letter from Ronald V. Powers, Deputy Commissioner of Taxation, to Earl H. Maffett, Assessor for the Village of Richfield, relative to attendance at a meeting of a group of township and village assessors who have formed an organization, were read and referred to the next Board meeting.

A letter from the City Clerk of Hopkins, with resolution attached, requesting conveyance of a certain lot from the County of Hennepin to the City of Hopkins was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from the Arnold Office Machines Company addressed to Mr. Matthews, Chairman, County Commissioners, requesting an interview was read. Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner

Christensen, that the Board accept the offer of Arnold Office
Machines Company to install Robotyper machines in the office of the
Register of Deeds on a trial basis, without cost to the County of
Hennepin, and recommending that the Register of Deeds also accept
the offer.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth nay, Christensen yea, Hanson nay, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews nay. Motion lost.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, submitting the application of Terrence L. Webster to fill and rip-rap the shoreline at Lake Minnetonka, was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, submitting a survey of a part of the Hennepin County farm property at Hopkins was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter was read from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, notifying the Board that he is awarding the contract for the purchase of four 2-ton trucks to the International Harvester Company and requesting that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to sign a contract and that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay for said contract.

Commissioner Christensen moved that the contract be divided and that the Board purchase two Ford trucks and two International Harvester trucks. The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth nay, Christensen nay, Hanson nay, Scott nay, Chairman Matthews nay.

Motion lost.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, to accept

the recommendation of the Budget and Purchasing Agent, and that the bid of International Harvester Company be accepted at the net bid price of \$13,538.32 for four 2-ton trucks with dump boxes, and that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$13,538.32 for the Road and Bridge fund to pay for said trucks, being Project No. 5201-4.

Voting on the motion there were five YEAS and no NAYS, as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea. Motion carried.

A letter was read from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, relative to bids for two 4-wheel drive trucks and recommending that the bid of Minnesota F.W.D. Company be accepted, and requesting that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to sign a contract and that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds to pay for said trucks.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, submitting an easement from the trustees of the Church of St. Jane Chantal of Corcoran and others for County Road No. 50 was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, requesting approval for acceptance of the low bids of Hull-Dobbs for nine 2-door sedans for the Sheriff's office and of the Woodhead Company, Inc. for one 1/2-ton Pick-up truck for the Highway Department, were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting authority to attend the Municipal Finance Officers' Association annual convention to beheld at Boston, Massachusetts, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Highway Engineer, reporting on road closings approaching the Minnesota River bridges was read and ordered placed on file.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 29, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the appraisal and sale of certain tax forfeited lands.
- 2. Recommending the addition of special assessments to the appraised valuation of the tax forfeited lands described in Special Assessments List No. 65.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Health Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing office furniture to Hennepin County for the offices of District Court Judges Hall and Weeks. The bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent and the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. For one 48-passenger bus for general use at the Home School For Boys.
  - 2. For furnishing approximately 110,000 gallons of S.C. Asphalt.
  - 3. For furnishing approximately 110,000 gallons of M.C. Asphalt.
  - 4. For furnishing approximately 40,000 gallons of R.C. Asphalt.
- 5. For furnishing approximately 40,000 gallons of Asphalt Emulsion.

The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter was read from Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, and L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, reporting on the proposed sale of a part of the Hennepin County Home site in the City of Hopkins. A letter from W. L. Taylor, City Manager for the City of Hopkins, expressing the official views of the City Council's policy in the matter was read and ordered incorporated in the minutes of the County Board meeting, as follows:

April 28, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners Hennepin County, Minnesota

#### Gentlemen:

Representatives of the City have discussed with the County Surveyor and the County Engineer the problems involved in the proposed disposition of part of the County Home site in Hopkins.

The policy of the City Council will be:

- 1. To accept a warranty deed for the vacated lots lying in the south 223.9 feet of block 63, with immediate development of Lot 13 as a lift station for the Peaceful Valley Sanitary Sewer. The remainder of this tract will be developed for recreational purposes to serve as a buffer between the lift station and the residences proposed for the balance of the site. This recreational development will replace the present similar development North of this site.
- 2. To accept, under its ordinances controlling platting, plats for the remainder of the tract only when such plats contain street dedications which do not abut the west line of the tract reserved for the County Home.
- 3. To accept platting of contiguous property only so as to continue alignment of north-south streets so that no dead ended streets exist within the site.
- 4. To provide storm sewers for drainage of the low areas on Block 43 and 44 on or before the time when 50% of the lots platted are built upon, subject only to vote of the people of the money for a bond issue. As was explained to Mr. Zimmerman our storm sewers system has been enlarged nearly every other year; however because such extensions are financed as a general obligation of the city, to get the bond issue passed we will wait until we get a number of small projects throughout the city. The policy of the city in the past has been to provide storm sewering when needed in this manner.

This has been discussed completely with the Hopkins City Council and I am directed to inform you that these views are an official expression of the Council's policy.
