Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 3, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Members absent: Commissioners Christensen and Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of May 31, 1952, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, submitting an opinion from the attorney general as to whether charges for laboratory diagnoses at the University Hospitals, which are not available at the Minneapolis General Hospital, may be paid by Hennepin County for resident patients of the Minneapolis General Hospital, was read and ordered placed on file. The Clerk to the Board was directed to furnish copies of the opinion to each of the commissioners.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Submitting contracts and contract bonds from Wheeling Corrugating Company and from Park Construction Company.
- 2. Recommending acceptance of the low bids of American Lithofold Corporation for tax statement forms for the County Treasurer's office and of Gust Anderson for roof repairs to be made at the County Home under the supervision of Fred Crisp.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Submitting applications of A. G. Peterson, Clifford Steinkamp, Dr. Henry Lysne, and C.H. Diedrich for permits for dredging, excavating, and other improvements at Lake Minnetonka. Ordered placed on file.
- 2. Recommending the transfer to the City of Hopkins by the Board of County Commissioners of that portion of the old railroad right-of-way between 17th Avenue and 13th Avenue in the City of Hopkins. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time stated in the published advertisement for bids, Stanley Cowles, Assistant County Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing materials to Hennepin County for the construction of a steel sea wall at Seton Channel, Lake Minnetonka. The bids were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Commissioner Ainsworth offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the low bid of Armco Drainage & Metal Products, Inc. for furnishing to Hennepin County materials for construction of a steel sea wall at Seton Channel, Lake Minnetonka, being Project No. 524, be accepted at the bid price of \$7,093.69; and

That Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$7,093.69 from the Lake Improvement Appropriation to pay for said materials; and

That the Chairman of the County Board be authorized to sign the contract when bond is approved.
