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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 29, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the Board, submitting a form of agreement between the County of Hennepin and the State Department of Highways relative to the proposed relocation of Cedar Lake Road at its intersection with Trunk Highway No. 100 was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, relative to the agreement with the State Highway Department for the separation of grade of State Aid Road No. 16 and Trunk Highway No. 100 was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from George A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting approval of exchange of county depository securities by the Midland National Bank was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting the Municipal Building Commission Budget for the year 1953 was read and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from Rodney S. Wallace, Captain, Hennepin County Sheriffs Rescue Squad, relative to the donation of an Auxillary Rescue Squad truck and mobile radio station was read and referred to Ed Ryan, Sheriff, for a report and recommendation. The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, Purshasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for construction of a bridge at Medicine Lake, being Project No. 5108-1. Mr. Pearson recommended acceptance of the low bid of Carl Quist, General Contracting. The bids were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Monthly reports from George C. Roadfelt County Agricultural Agent and Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles were presented and ordered placed on file.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowance as of July 31st, 1952, was received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

A letter from the City of Hopkins, inquiring whether additional use of the County's radio facilities might result in lowered costs to the City per unit used and whether suburban municipalities whose needs require it, might be permitted to have their own central transmission stations for their own localized dispatching, operating on the same frequency as the Sheriff's radio net, was read and

and referred to Ole Pearson, Budget Director, for a report at the next Board meeting.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, submitting a contract and contract bond from Carl Quist for construction of a concrete box culvert on County Road No. 101, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, recommending that the claims of Richard Hagen and Russell Hagen for alleged injuries and property damages on County Road No. 134 be disallowed, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 12, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Christensen and Scott and Vice-Chairman Ainsworth.

Members absent: Commissioner Hanson and Chairman Matthews.

The meeting was called to order by S.E. Ainsworth, Vice-Chairman.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, recommending acceptance of the low bid on Project No. 5108-1, the erection of Bridge No. 411 on County Road No. 70, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A petition for the establishment of a public ditch in the Town of Brooklyn, signed by A. B. Loth and 43 others, was referred to the Road and Lake Committee and the Attorney for the County Board.

A certificate received from Ejvirid Andersen, Clerk of Common School District No. 31, showing the result of an election on the question of the dissolution of said school district, with attached ballot, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A proposed amended contract in triplicate between the City of Minneapolis, the Village of St. Louis Park, and the County of Hennepin,

A motion was made by Commissioner Christensen, seconded by Commissioner Scott, and unanimously carried, to authorize the County Board chairman to sign, with the City of Minneapolis and the Village of St. Louis Park, the above mentioned agreement providing for said paving of France Avenue South between Cedar Lake Avenue and Lake Street, subject to the approval of the County Attorney as to the form of the agreement.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of George O. Johnson asking that his land be set off from School District No. 40 to School District No. 37. A letter from Robert E. Scott, as Executive Secretary of the Hennepin County School Survey Committee, asking that no action be taken until the committee has more information before it, and another letter from Mr. Scott as County Superintendent of Schools, recommending disapproval of the petition, were read. The Clerk to the Board presented the Auditor's certificate of mailing notices of said hearing, the Sheriff's certificate of posting notices, and the publisher's affidavit of publication of said notices. There being no appearance either for or against the granting of said petition the matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., the Board proceeded with the continued hearing relative to obstructions to County Ditch No. 18. The Clerk to the Board presented the Auditor's certificate of mailing notices of the hearing to interested parties. Attorney Lawrence L. Olson and Mr. L. Z. Carlson appeared requesting information as to the authority for work done on County Ditch No. 18 affecting Mr. Carlson's property at 32nd Avenue North near the Belt Line Highway. They were answered by Mr. Zimmerman, County Engineer. A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, was read, stating that the plans for reconstruction of that portion of County Ditch No. 18 North of 34th Avenue were incomplete and recommending that the hearing be continued until Tuesday, October 14, 1952, A motion was made by Commissioner Christensen, duly seconded and unanimously carried, to continue the hearing as recommended until Tuesday, October 14, 1952, at 10:30 o'clock A.M.

At or about 10:30 o'clock A.M., the Board proceeded with the continued hearing on the matter of the attachment and distribution of assets of School District No. 27, the Abraham Lincoln School District, which was dissolved on July 16, 1952. Three letters from Lloyd Smith, Clerk of School District No. 27, showing the assets of said school district, were presented to the Board. Edward J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, presented the proposed distribution between School District No. 43 and School District No. 24 of the assets of said School District No. 27. A letter from the school board of District No. 27 offering to help the County Board "or any other authority that may be designated to operate our school district until such time as our services are no longer requested" was read to the Board.

Commissioner Chartensen offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The matter of the attachment of the territory which comprised Independent School District No. 27 (commonly known as Abraham Lincoln School District) came on for hearing before this Board on the 19th day of June, 1952, upon notice given pursuant to a resolution adopted by this Board at its meeting held on May 13, 1952, which hearing was adjourned from time to time, the final hearing being had on this 12th day of August, 1952. It was made to appear to the satisfaction of this Board that the notice of said hearing had been published, posted and served as required by law and its order; and,

WHEREAS, After hearing all persons interested and desiring to be heard in said matter, both for and against, and having considered the interests of all the territory affected herein; and having considered the nature and amount of the assets and obligations of said Independent School District No. 27; and this Board being fully advised,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Board finds as follows:

- l. That at a special meeting of Independent School District No. 27 held on April 21, 1952, a resolution was adopted by a majority vote of the electors at said meeting petitioning this Board to take necessary and appropriate action under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 122.28, to dissolve said School District; that a certificate of the clerk of said School District setting forth said resolution and showing the result of the vote thereon was presented to this Board; and that this Board by resolution adopted at its meeting held on the 16th day of July, 1952, dissolved said Independent School District No. 27.
- 2. That the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within the territory which comprised Independent School District No. 27 is \$498,297; that the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within that part of the territory of said School District attached by this resolution and order to Independent School District No. 43 (commonly known as Osseo School District) is \$58,086; and that the assessed valuation of the taxable real property within that part of the territory of said School District No. 27 attached by this resolution and order to Independent School District No. 24 (commonly known as Robbinsdale School District) is \$440,211.

- 3. That the assets of said dissolved school district No. 27 consist of school equipment and school supplies, including books, maps, desks, seats, tables and chairs valued at \$13,134; real property and the school building and playground fixtures situated thereon, the same being reasonably worth and valued at \$180,000; funds in the hands of the Treasurer of said district No. 27 totaling the sum of \$168,772.82; and that in addition thereto, funds in the hands of the County Treasurer belonging to said dissolved school district.
- 4. That said dissolved school district has outstanding obligations, other than bonded indebtedness, totaling the sum of \$4,674.99, which obligations include salaries due to the school principal, his office secretary, and to the school maintenance man for services rendered between August 1, 1952, and August 12, 1952, both dates inclusive, and including salaries due to teachers for services rendered during the school year 1951-1952 pursuant to contracts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it be, and it is hereby Ordered:

- 1. That all the territory which comprised Independent School District No. 27, except that part thereof described in the next succeeding paragraph, be and the same is hereby attached to Independent School District No. 24.
- 2. That all that part of the territory which comprised Independent School District No. 27 lying North of the East and West center line of Sections 31, 32 and 33, Township 119, Range 21, Hennepin County, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby attached to Independent School District No. 43.
- 3. That all the lands owned by Independent School District No. 27, including the school building and the playground fixtures situated thereon, lying and being in the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, and described as follows, to-wit:

That part of West ½ of Southeast ¼ of Southwest ¼ of Section 32, Township 119, Range 21, described as follows: Commencing at a point in West line of West ½, which point is 257 feet North from Southwest corner of said West ½; thence North, along the said West line a distance of 139.7 feet; thence East parallel with South line of said West ½, a distance of 662.8 feet, more or less to East line of the said West ½; thence South along said East line a distance of 396.7 feet to Southeast corner of said West ½; thence West along South line of said West ½

- 4. That said school equipment and supplies be and the same are hereby assigned, transferred and awarded to Independent School District No. 24.
- 5. That the funds in the hands of the Treasurer of said School District No. 27 be and the same are hereby apportioned, assigned and awarded as follows:
  - To Independent School District No.24, the sum of \$127,119.59
  - To Independent School District No. 43, the sum of \$41,653.23.
- 6. That the funds in the hands of the County Treasurer belonging to said dissolved School District No.27, which were collected and received by said County Treasurer on and prior to May 31, 1952, be and the same are hereby apportioned and awarded as follows:
  - To Independent School District No. 24, a sum equal to 88.34% thereof.
  - To Independent School District No. 43, a sum equal to 11.66% thereof.
- 7. That the taxes collected and received by the County Treasurer on and after June 1, 1952, from and on account of

taxable property located in the territory which comprised Independent School District No. 27, be apportioned in accordance with the location of the property from and on account of which the taxes are so collected; taxes so collected from and on account of property within that part of said territory attached to Independent School District No. 24 to be awarded and paid over to Independent School District No. 24; and that taxes so collected from and on account of property located within that part of said territory attached to Independent School District No. 43 be awarded and paid over to Independent School District No. 43.

- (e) Providing for the sale and transfer to or between county departments, boards, commissions and agencies of goods, materials, supplies and equipment which are surplus with other departments, boards, commissions or agencies, and for the disposition by sale, after receipt of competitive bids of goods, materials, supplies and equipment which are obsolete and unusable;
- (f) Determining whether a deposit is to be submitted with a bid on a purchase contract or sale, and if required, prescribing the amount and form thereof and providing that such deposit shall be forfeited if the successful bidder refuses to enter into a contract and post a contract bond within ten days after the award:
- (g) Prescribing the procedure and form for securing from bidders and prospective bidders the data necessary to determine whether or not they are responsible;
- (h) Prescribing the manner in which invoices for goods, materials, supplies and equipment delivered to any or all departments, boards, commissions and agencies of the county shall be submitted, examined and approved; and
- (i) Providing for such other matters as may be necessary to give effect to the foregoing rules and provisions of this act."

WHEREAS, none of the foregoing statuory requirements have thus

far been executed by the Budget and Purchasing Agent of Hennepin County,

Two letters received from Dr. F. G. Gunlaugson requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

An application for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open two purported bids received for furnishing corrugated metal culverts on Project No. 5205-1. After opening the envelopes it was discovered that one was not a bid but merely an explanation of the inability of the firm to bid on this project.

WHEREAS, Chapter 556, Laws 1951, Section 6, reads as follows:

"The agent, subject to the approval of the county board, shall adopt, promulgate, and from time to time amend and file with the county auditor rules and regulations for the following purposes:

- (a) Prescribing the manner in which goods, materials, supplies and equipment shall be purchased, delivered, stored and distributed;
- (b) Prescribing the forms for requisitions, the manner of their authentication, and their revision by the county purchasing agent;
- (c) Prescribing the manner of inspecting all deliveries of goods, materials, supplies and equipment and of making chemical and physical tests of samples submitted with bids and samples of deliveries to determine compliance with specifications;
- (d) Requiring reports by county departments, boards, and agencies of stocks of supplies, obsolete or unusable goods, materials, supplies and equipment on hand and prescribing the form of such report;
- (e) Providing for the sale and transfer to or between county departments, boards, commissions and agencies of goods, materials, supplies and equipment which are surplus with other departments, boards, commissions or agencies, and for the disposition by sale, after receipt of competitive bids of goods, materials, supplies and equipment which are obsolete and unusable;
- (f) Determining whether a deposit is to be submitted with a bid on a purchase contract or sale, and if required, prescribing the amount and form thereof and providing that such deposit shall be forfeited if the successful bidder refuses to enter into a contract and post a contract bond within ten days after the award;
- (g) Prescribing the procedure and form for securing from bidders and prospective bidders the data necessary to determine whether or not they are responsible;
- (h) Prescribing the manner in which invoices for goods, materials, supplies and equipment delivered to any or all departments, boards, commissions and agencies of the county shall be submitted, examined and approved; and
- (i) Providing for such other matters as may be necessary to give effect to the foregoing rules and provisions of this act."

WHEREAS, noneof the foregoing statutory requirements have thus far been executed by the Budget and Purchasing Agent of Hennepin County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That said Budget and Purchasing Agent be required forthwith to file with the County Auditor, rules and regulations for the purposes set forth in said Chapter 556, Laws 1951, Section 6, Sub-Sections (a) through (i), as hereinbefore quoted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said Budget and Purchasing Agent be required to file with the Board of County Commissioners at the end of each month, a financial reportlisting purchases made by him on behalf of the various departments, boards and commissions under the jurisdiction of the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners, the amounts of such purchases for each of such departments and the balances remaining in the several funds dedicated to such purchases.

A letter from the State of Minnesota, Division of Public Institutions, relative to recommended precautions to be taken at the County Jail was read and referred to the Attorney for the County Board and a copy of said letter was ordered forwarded to the Municipal Building Commission.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting the Board to authorize the Supervisor of Assessments to hire additional personnel to re-extend assessed valuations in various towns, villages, and cities in Hennepin County outside the City of Minneapolis, was read and referred to the Attorney.

A letter from W. W. Douglas, Superintendent, Home School for Boys, relative to reroofing buildings and repairing cesspools at the school was read and referred to the Committee on County Homes.

A letter of resignation was received from A. C. Ekelund,

Superintendent of the County Home and from his wife as matron.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, to accept the resignations and that the Chairman of the County Board be authorized to send a letter to Mr. and Mrs. Ekelund thanking them for their many years of service to Hennepin County.

A report was received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, relative to the 1952 budget.

Olson, Attorney, appeared before the Board relative to the cleaning out of County Ditch No. 18, stating that according to a report from Cartwright & Olson, Engineers, the ditch was cut much below the original profile causing a very hazardous condition. Byron McCullagh, Attorney for the Villages of Crystal and Golden Valley and the City of Robbinsdale, addressed the Board stating that the three municipalities which he represented were willing to pay for the cost of cleaning out said County Ditch No. 18.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, that the ditch engineers be instructed to proceed with the cleaning out of County Ditch No. 18, work not to be started until after receipt of letters from the three municipalities stating that they will pay for the costs incurred.
