Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, September 2, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, was ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, submitting an easement for County Road No. 16 from Millard T. Wolfram and wife was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters from Dr. F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Health Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium, were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Two letters from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, requesting the transfer of funds from the Road and Bridge Fund to the M.C. Asphalt contract, being Project No. 5202-4, were read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A petition signed by Patrick P. McQuillan asking that his lands be set off from School District No. 104 to School District No. 144 was presented. Mr. McQuillan appeared before the Board requesting that his petition be withdrawn, which request was granted.

The plat of Shingle Creek Park Second located in the Town of Brooklyn was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A notice from the Railroad and Warehouse Commission of a hearing to be held on Tuesday, November 18, 1952, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., on the petition of Hennepin County asking for an investigation of conditions surrounding the railroad crossing at State Trunk Highway No. 110 and the tracks of the Great Northern Railroad Company was read. The Attorney for the County Board was requested to write the Railroad and Warehouse Commission asking that the hearing be held at the site.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, requesting the transfer of funds from the Emergency Fund to the State Hospital for Insane Fund was read and the matter was ordered held pending the outcome of the State Institutions and County Hospitals Fund.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, submitting an application from C. W. Carlson to clean up the shoreline at Forest Lake Bay, Lake Minnetonka, was read and ordered placed on file.

A petition for the improvement of County Road No. 122 by the placing of a proper gravel surface and the repair of the low portions of the grade so they will not break up in the spring was presented and referred to the County Engineer and the Road and Lake Committee.

A petition signed by M.E. Frigaard and 27 others requesting the

County Engineer to make a survey of the loose sand and gravel on State Highway No. 55 was read.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the Engineer be requested to contact the State Highway Department asking that they put State Highway No. 55 into repair and that a copy of the petition accompany the request.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, by W. H. Fabriz, Chief, Detective and Civil Divisions, reporting on the pick-up at Waco, Texas, of two runaway boys from the Glen Lake School for Boys, was read and ordered placed on file.

Commissioner Christensen moved that the Sheriff be notified that no bills will be approved by the County Board for picking up prisoners unless the Sheriff's men are deputized.

Motion unanimously carried.

A tentative plat of the Hennepin County Home School for Girls property waspresented and Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that the plat be approved.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Scott moved that the buildings on the Home School for Girls property be offered for sale and that they be removed from the property.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, that the entire matter pertaining to the Home School for Girls property be referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent for a report back to the Board. Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Christensen moved that whereas it takes  $5\frac{1}{2}$  mills to maintain Glen Lake Sanatorium, a proper bill be prepared by the County Attorney's office to have the State of Minnesota take over the

said Glen Lake Sanatorium.

It was regularly moved and seconded that the motion be tabled.

Voting on the motion to table was as follows: Ainsworth yea,

Motion to table carried.

Motion carried.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent proceeded to open bids for furnishing corrugated metal culverts to Hennepin County. A letter was read from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, concurred in by O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, recommending that as nearly as practicable one-half of the order be purchased from each of the two bidders.

Commissioner Scott moved that the bid of Armco Drainage & Metal Products Co. Inc. be accepted for furnishing corrugated metal culverts for State Aid Road No. 64, being Project No. 5205-1, at the bid price of \$1465.78 and that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$1465.78 from the Road and Bridge Fund to pay for said culvert material.

Motion unanimously carried.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the dissolution of School Districts No. 31 and No. 131. The Clerk to the Board presented the Sheriff's certificates of posting notices of said hearings, the County Auditor's certificate of mailing notices, and the affidavit of publication of said notices. A.T. Miller, Chairman of/School Board of School District No. 131 and Dorothy Palmer, Chairman of the School Board of School District No. 31 appeared before the Board requesting that there be no delay in dissolving and attaching the said school districts. Letters were received from Robert E. Scott, as County Superintendent of Schools and also from Mr. Scott as Secretary of the School Survey Committee, recommending that School Districts No. 31 and No. 131 be dissolved and attached to School District No. 43. A Certificate of Election from Blanche Anderson, Clerk of School District No. 131 showing the result of the election held in said district to assume its proportionate share of the existing bonded indebtedness of School District No. 43 was read. The matter of the two dissolutions was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, A.C. Ekelund, Superintendent of the County Home, and George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, were presented and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, relative to the application of the Eberhardt Company for a refund of a mortgage registration tax was read and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Specifications received from O. A. Pearson, County Budget and Purchasing Agent, for certificates of title and memorial sheets for the office of the Registrar of Titles were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. F.G. Gunlaugson, Director of the Bureau of Health Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium, was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L.P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as

follows:

- 1. Requesting the transfer of funds to cover overruns in the Richards Oil Company contract for M.C. Asphalt, the Northwestern Refining Company contract for S.C.Asphalt, and the Wheeler Lumber Bridge & Supply Company contract for materials for the Medicine Lake Bridge.
- 2. Requesting a release of \$10,000.00 from the Reserve for Contingencies Fund for the purchase of bituminous materials.
- 3. Requesting that permission be granted the Minneapolis Gas Company to install a gas main on a portion of the old street railway right-of-way.

The above letters were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, recommending that the cost for repairing the roofs over the dining halls and the front porch at the County Home be paid from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund was read and Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the sum of \$956.00 for said repairs be paid from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund.

A summons from the District Court, Seventh Judicial District, in the matter of Zelah M. Stewart as Executrix under the Last Will and Testament of Clara H. Freeman, deceased, vs. The County of Hennepin, etal, was presented and referred to the Legal Department Civil.

Gene Arnold from the Sheriff's office, appeared at the Board meeting relative to the establishment of a pistol range. Commissioner

Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, that the Chairman of the Board appoint Commissioner Scott to obtain information relative to the establishment of a pistol range and present his findings to the Legislative Committee.

- O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, made the following reports:
- 1. Relative to the sewage disposal plant at the Home School for Boys. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, that Magney, Tusler & Setter, Architects and Engineers, be authorized to prepare plans, specifications, and an estimate of cost for a sewage disposal system at the Home School for Boys, the cost for said services to be paid from the County Reserve, Building and Maintenance Fund. Motion unanimously carried.
- 2. Relative to the disposition of the bodies from Potters Field at the County Home. Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the matter be referred to the Attorney for the Board. Motion unanimously carried.
- 3. Relative to County-owhed equipment used by the Public Health Nurses Department. Mr. Pearsons stated that according to the inventory in the office of the County Auditor the equipment is valued at \$2556.80. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the equipment be transferred to the Public Health Nurses Department for the sum of \$1200.00.
