Tuesday, September 30, 1952

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Commissioner Hanson reported on the Coroner's office, stating that Dr. Heim had agreed to appoint Dr. Reinold G. Johnson as Acting-Temporary Coroner.

Mr. Joe Roche appeared before the Board relative to an application for reduction in the assessed valuation of his property in the City of Robbinsdale. The matter was deferred until after adjournment of the State Board of Equalization.

An order of the District Court appointing a teacher at the Home School for Boys and increasing the salary of a dairyman at said home was presented and referred to the Committee on County Homes.

A plat of Portland Elms Fourth Addition located in the Town of Bloomington was presented and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A certificate of election for the dissolution of School District No. 101 was received from Raymond Kriefall, Clerk, and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O.A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing certificates of title and memorial sheets to Hennepin County for the office of the Registrar of Titles. The bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent and the Committee on Ways and Means for a report to be made at the Board meeting next week.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Mrs. Albert Eggert asking that her lands be set off from School District No. 47 to School District No. 24. The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of printing the notices of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting notices, and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices. A letter was read from Robert E. Scott, Superintendent of the Hennepin County Schools, recommending approval of Mrs. Eggert's petition. Mr. Richard Parish, Chairman of the Robbinsdale School Board, appeared before the County Board objecting to the set-off as the Robbinsdale schools are overly crowded. Mrs. Eggert appeared before the Board in support of her petition, stating that her six-year old child has to walk two and one-half miles to school. The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

ORDER SETTING OFF FREEHOLDER FROM ONE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ANOTHER

STATE OF MINNESOTA )
COUNTY OF HENNEPIN )

At a regular meeting of the County Board of Hennepin County, State of Minnesota, held on the 30th day of September, 1952, the petition of Mrs. Albert Eggert asking that her land described in said petition be set off from School District No. 47 to School District No. 24 in said County came on to be heard by said Board; and it having been made to appear to its satisfaction that notice of said hearing had been published, posted, and served as required by law and its order, said Board, having heard all persons interested in said matter, both for and against, finds as follows:

That said petitioner is a freeholder and resident of said county; and that she owns land now in School District No. 47 in said county, described as follows, to-wit:

North 1/2 of Southeast one-quarter of Southeast one-quarter of Section 9, Township 118, Range 22

and that said land adjoins School District No. 24 in said County.

That the reason for setting off said land of petitioner is as follows:

Because children have 3 miles to walk to school, otherwise only one mile to Bus line.

IT IS THEREFORE DETERMINED AND ORDERED: That the said land of said petitioner as above described be, and the same hereby is set off from said School District No. 47 to said School District No. 24 in

said county; and that hereafter said land be and constitute a part of said School District No. 24.

Reports from Robert E. Scott, Superintendent of Hennepin County Schools, on the cost for transportation and tuition for non-resident secondary school pupils were presented and referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from L.P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, recommending additional work in Lake Minnetonka was read and referred to the Road and

Lake Committee.

At 10:30 o'clock A.M., the continued hearing on the obstruction to County Ditch No. 18 was called for. There were no appearances or reports on the matter and the hearing was again continued to Tuesday, October 28, 1952, at 10:30 o'clock A.M.
