Thursday, March 5th, 1953.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A. M. pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A petition for the incorporation of the Village of Lynnacres was presented. Harold Strom appeared before the Board in support of the petition.

Rodney Wallace appeared before the Board requesting compensation insurance for volunteer special deputy sheriffs who operate the Sheriff's emergency rescue squad unit. L. E. Benson of the Anderson Agency called the Board's attention to the necessity of carrying compensation insurance on the special deputies. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott to approve the proposal of the Anderson Agency for a premium of \$10.71 per man per year. Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from the Historical Society submitting copy of a resolution requesting approval by the County Board of a bill authorizing a levy of not to exceed 1/20th of a mill for historical society purposes was read. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott that the Attorney for the Board be requested to draw up a bill increasing the amount the County Board may appropriate for historical society purposes from \$5,000.00 per year to \$10,000.00 per year. Voting on the motion, Ainsworth, yea; Christensen, passing; Hanson, yea; Scott, yea; Chairman Matthews, yea. Motion carried.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A. M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

At 10:20 o'clock A. M., hearing was called for on the dissolution of School District No. 28. The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing, the Sheriff's return of posting, and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing the notices of hearing. Letters were read from Robert E. Scott, County Superintendent of Schools and as Executive Secretary of the School Survey Committee, recommending the dissolution and attachment of School District No. 28 to School District No. 43. There was no opposition to the dissolution of the said District. The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the withdrawal from sale of tax forfeited lands described in attached list 362-W, the combination and division of tax forfeited lands described in attached list 362-DC and the classification of tax forfeited lands described in attached list 362-C. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings for further consideration.
 - 2. Recommending the appraisal of a certain tax forfeited

lot for rental purposes. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Repairing roofs of Guilford Hall and Smith Cottage at the Home School for Boys.
 - 2. Four tudor sedans for the Sheriff.
 - 3. Four tudor patrol coaches for the Sheriff.
 - 4. Furnishing sand and gravel, Project No. 5302-6.
 - 5. Lubricating oil, Project No. 5302-5.
 - 6. Hot plant mix bituminous material, Project No. 5302-7.

The above specifications were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, except the specifications for lubricating oil were ordered held until the next Board meeting.

A letter from W. W. Douglas, Supt. of the Home School for Boys, requesting various items as shown on attached list from the County Home was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Eddy L. Nordquist, offering to purchase a radio at the County Home after the Home is discontinued, was read and ordered placed on file.

Letters from O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside funds for awards that he has made on bids submitted to the Board March 3rd, 1953, were read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, requesting that the County Auditor be directed to set aside the sum of \$8,850.00 from the Road and Bridge fund to Project No. 5303-1, the

the award having been made to the low bidder, Woodrich Construction Co. was read and Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott to concur in the request of Mr. Pearson. Voting on the motion, Ainsworth, yea; Christensen, yea; Hanson, yea; Scott, yea; Chairman Matthews, yea; Motion carried.

A letter from Ray C. Ewald, Secretary of the City Planning Commission, notifying the Board that tax forfeited lands now held for future highway purposes should be retained, was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

WHEREAS, At a special meeting of Common School District No. 28, held on January 27th, 1953, a resolution to dissolve said district was adopted by a majority of the electors at said meeting, and a certificate of the clerk of said Common School District No. 28 setting forth said resolution and showing the result of the vote thereon was presented to the County Board of this County; and that by resolution adopted this 10th day of March, 1953, said County Board dissolved said Common School District No. 28; and

WHEREAS, By resolution adopted at its meeting held on February 10th, 1953, said County Board ordered that a hearing be had on the 10th day of March, 1953, at 10:20 o'clock A.M., in Committee Room 130 Court House, in the City of Minneapolis, in said County, for the purpose of determining to which existing school district or districts the territory comprising said Common School District No. 28 shall be attached in the event of the dissolution thereof, and ordered that a notice of hearing be given as provided by law as in other cases of change of boundaries of school districts; and

WHEREAS, Said notice of the time and place of said hearing was duly given by posting a copy thereof in three public places in each of the school districts to be or which may be affected by these proceedings, namely School Districts No. 28, No. 27, No. 118, No. 43, No. 24 and No. 220 ten days prior to the time of such hearing; and by mailing

to the Clerk of each of the school districts above named a true and correct copy of said notice at least ten days prior to said hearing, and by publication of said notice for two weeks in the Finance and Commerce, a legal newspaper printed and published in said Hennepin County, which said newspaper has heretofore been designated by said County Board as the official paper of said County for the publication of the proceedings of said Board and the publication of all legal notices ordered published by the said Board; and that due proof of said posting, mailing, and publication have been filed with the County Auditor of said County; and
