Tuesday, June 16, 1953

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report received from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, recommending the repurchase of tax forfeited lands by the Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, as follows:

1. Relative to the registration of vital statistics in Hennepin County. Ordered placed on file and copies forwarded to the Minneapolis City Council and to the Clerk of District Court.

2. Relative to a claim from the Village of Edina for work done on County Road No. 17 between 51st and 54th Streets in 1952. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, requesting

authority to attend the annual convention of the National Association of County Recorders to be held in Boston, Massachusetts from July 12th to 14th was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

1. Submitting plans for the improvement of S.A.R. No. 6 from the Minneapolis city limits to a point westerly of Bassett's Creek. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

2. Submitting notification of the application by O. J. Ellertson for permit to sand beach at Gideon's Bay, Lake Minnetonka, was ordered placed on file.

A contract and contract bond from Carl Quist for remodeling Bridge No. 9 on S.A.R. No. 19 were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, requesting the County Auditor to set aside funds to the M.B. Coffee Company contract for furnishing coffee to the County Jail and to the Teske Coal & Feed Company contract and the Farmers & Merchants Milling Company contract for furnishing farm feed to the Home School for Boys. The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Health Department, City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Hennepin County Agricultural Society requesting use of Storage Buildings No. 4 and No. 23, the entrance half of the Shop Building, and the space between said buildings not required for

County use, for the Hennepin County Fair was read.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the request be granted. Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Frank Mlekoday, Chief Jailer, calling the Board's attention to the expiration of the contract for board of United States prisoners, and the rate charged per day, was read and referred to the Attorney for the County Board.

A letter was read from the Anderson Agency addressed to O. A. Pearson, Director of Purchases, relative to the carrying of insurance, by the County, in a mutual company.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen, to accept the low bid of Wilbur Bennington of the Mutual Service Company for bodily injury or death and property damage insurance at the bid price of \$4885.00.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen yea, Hanson yea, Scott nay, Chairman Matthews yea.

A letter from Joseph Hilt, Business Representative, Brotherhood of Painters, Decorators, and Paperhangers Local Union No. 386, submitting an amendment to the existing collective bargaining agreement was read and referred to the County Engineer.

Mr. O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, reported on the annual report of the Animal Rescue League and recommended that no funds be set up in the 1954 budget for the League.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the claim of the Animal Rescue League for the year 1953 be allowed



for the first six months only and that no funds be provided for said Animal Rescue League in the budget for the year 1954.

A letter from the Hardware Mutual Insurance Company offering to purchase the Vince A. Day Center property was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Reynold R. Hagglund submitting his resignation as Engineer on County Ditch No. 46 was read and referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from the Raytector, Inc. requesting that various banks in the County be granted the same privileges as the Farmers State Bank of Hamel had to install their Raytector Hold-up Alarm System at the Sheriff's Broadcasting Station, was read. Mr. Flakne addressed the Board urging further consideration of the matter by the Board. Mr. Flakne was requested to write a letter to the Board outlining the company's request in detail.





A budget report of the Hennepin County Highway Department dated June 30, 1953, prepared by O. A. Pearson, Hennepin County Budget and Purchasing Agent, was ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by M. L. Peterson requesting that his land be set off from School District No. 205 to School District No. 17 was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.




