Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 14, 1953

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly report for the month of June, 1953, received from Frank E. Adams, Veterans Service Officer, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Commissioners, relative to the proposal to install the so-called Raytectar Police Signal System at the Sheriff's radio station was referred to the Sheriff, the Attorney for the County Board, and the County Purchasing Agent.

A letter was received from G. Howard Spaeth, Commissioner of Taxation, offering to send a representative from his department to discuss with the County Board the findings of the field appraisal team investigating the standard of assessments in all of the school districts in Hennepin County outside the City of Minneapolis. The Clerk to the County Board was instructed to write Mr. Spaeth, thanking him for his offer and arranging a meeting time.

A letter from Ray Amberg, Director, University of Minnesota

Hospitals, acknowledging receipt of a letter criticising the sanitary conditions in one of the hospital stations and promising a full investigation and correction of the situation if found to be as stated, was ordered placed on file.

A letter received from Geo. A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, listing collateral depository securities was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A petition from property owners of Navarre and Spring Park, signed by Mr. and Mrs. O. P. Hanson and 69 others, was received, requesting the removal of fences on County-owned property abutting on the channel between Crystal Bay and West Arm. The said fences prevent fishing in the channel from the shore.

A motion was made by Commissioner Scott, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, and unanimously carried, to instruct the county engineer to see that the fences are removed.

A petition, with attached plat of the proposed improvement, requesting permission and authority to realign, deepen and clean out Shingle Creek (County Ditch No. 13) and to fill in the abandoned creek bed was received from the City of Minneapolis through its Board of Park Commissioners. Said petition and plat were referred to the Road and Lake Committee and to the county engineer for a report back to the Board.

A letter received from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the condemnation of certain lands for highway purposes was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing

Agent, as follows:

- 1. Correcting the amount appropriated for the George T. Ryan Company contract, being Project No. 5301-9. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Awarding the contract for furnishing special aggregate for seal coat, Project No. 5302-19, on which bids were opened on July 7th. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
- 3. Awarding the contract for embankment construction, being Project No. 5206 for which bids were opened on July 7th. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, with attached easement from the City of Minneapolis acting through its Board of Park Commissioners, and Park Board committee report authorizing the same, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract performance bond received from Glen Nelson and Marvin J. Nelson, Co-partners, Dba Blacktop Surfacing Company, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, requesting the transfer of funds to cover an overrun of the contract for furnishing crushed rock, being Project No. 5302-17, was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Applications for reduction in the assessed valuations of personal property were received from the Red Owl Stores, Inc. and from the National Tea Company. The clerk to the County Board was instructed to notify the two applicants to appear before the County Board of Equalization on Monday, July 20, 1953, at 10:15 o'clock A.M. to be heard in

regard to said applications.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, County Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for printing real estate tax statements for 1953. Said bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent for a report to be made at the next Board meeting.

Commissioner Hanson offered the following resolution, and moved its adoption:

Commissioner Christensen offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, That the County of Hennepin will sell the following described property commonly known as the Vince A. Day Center on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

That part of Government Lot 6, Section 5, Township 28, Range 24, and of Government Lot 6, Section 32, Township 29, Range 24, described as follows: Beginning at a point in the center line of Lake Street where it intersects the South line of said section 32; thence northeasterly along the center line of Lake Street 400 feet: thence at right angles southeasterly 111.52 feet; thence deflecting 51 degrees 18 minutes to the right on a line bearing south 25 degrees 22 minutes West a distance of 279.73 feet; thence deflecting 8 degrees 15 minutes to the right on a line bearing South 33 degrees 37 minutes West a distance of 351.78 feet; thence deflecting 10 degrees 58 minutes to the right on a line bearing South 44 degrees 35 minutes West a distance of 167.50 feet; thence deflecting 13 degrees 39 minutes to the right on a line bearing South 58 degrees 14 minutes West a distance of 212.09 feet; thence deflecting 89 degrees 25 minutes to the right on a line bearing North 32 degrees 21 minutes West a distance of 545.48 feet, more or less, to the center line of Excelsior Avenue, thence northeasterly along the center line of Excelsior Avenue to the point of beginning, EXCEPT the following described portion thereof taken for the widening of West Calhoun Boulevard:

That part of Government Lot 6, Section 32, Township 29, Range 24 and that part of Lot 1, Auditor's Subdivision Number 164, Hennepin County, Minnesota, which lies within the following described lines: Commencing at intersection of center line of West Lake Street with the South line of Government Lot 6. thence northeasterly along said center line of West Lake Street a distance of 375 feet; thence southeasterly at right angles to point on the southeasterly line of West Lake Street, said point being the beginning of land to be taken; thence northeasterly on the southeasterly line of West Lake Street and southeasterly and southwesterly on the southwesterly and northwesterly lines of West Calhoun Boulevard to a point on the northwesterly line of West Calhoun Boulevard distant 25 feet South of the South line of said Government Lot 6; thence northerly to a point on a straight line, which straight line if produced would intersect the southeasterly line of West Lake Street 25 feet northeasterly from the point of beginning, said point on the straight line being 25 feet southerly

measured along the production of said straight line; thence northerly, northwesterly, westerly, and southwesterly on a curve to the left whose radius is 20 feet to point of beginning, according to the plat of said subdivision and the map of said section on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Hennepin County, Minnesota

The sale of said property will be considered by this board at a meeting thereof to be held at Room 130 Court House, City of Minneapolis, on the 1st day of September, 1953, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., at which time bids for the purchase of the property will be considered. The terms and conditions of the sale shall be as follows:

- (1) All bids must be in writing and may be filed with the county auditor before the date of sale or with the county board on the day of the sale at any time before the bidding is closed. Bids may be sealed.
- (2) Each bidder must post a certified check in the sum of \$10,000 payable to the order of Hennepin County, conditioned to "abide by the terms of the offer if it is accepted", the proceeds of said check to be retained by the county as liquidated damages in the event the bidder shall fail to abide by the terms of his offer if his bid is accepted.
- (3) The sale will be for cash to be paid by the successful bidder to the county within ten (10) days after delivery by the County to the successful bidder of abstract of title to the property showing a good and marketable title in the county subject to the conditions, exceptions and reservations hereinafter set forth. Sale will be conducted by auction by the County Board.

- (4) The conveyance from the County will be subject to the following conditions, exceptions and reservations:
 - Building and zoning laws and regulations;
 - (b) Reservation of mineral rights;
 - (c) Unpaid installments of special assessments, if any;
 - (d) Restrictions of record, if any;
- (e) Delivery of possession of property will be given on September 15, 1953.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports for the month of June were received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff and from George G. Roadfeldt, County Agricultural Agent, and ordered placed on file.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- l. Notifying the County Board that the contract for furnishing real estate tax statements for 1953 had been awarded to Gopher Business Forms, Inc., the low bidder. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Requesting approval of the attached contract, drawn by
 Frank J.Williams, Attorney for the County Board, between the county
 and Raytectar, Inc. providing for the broadcasting of radio warning
 signals through the Sheriff's radio station. Referred to the Committee
 on Ways and Means.

Two letters from F. G. Gunlaugson, M.D., Director, Bureau of

Health Maintenance for the City of Minneapolis, requesting the commitment of two patients to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A notice of the application of C. O. Petterson for permit to excavate the channel at Libb's Lake was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Dr. Arthur E. Allen, President, Greater Lake
Minnetonka Council, Inc., thanking the Board for their consideration
of his organization's request for a new type of fish screen at Gray's
Bay dam was read and ordered placed on file.

A copy of a letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, addressed to Chester S. Wilson, State Commissioner of Conservation, relative to the operation of the fish screen at Gray's Bay dam, with replies from E. V. Willard, Deputy Commissioner of Conservation, and from Hjalmar O. Swenson, Supervisor, Bureau of Fisheries, were read to the Baard. Mr. Swenson stated that it would be agreeable with his department to take over the operation of the fish screen but that he would like to have the county continue its schedule of maintenance of the present screen until a new screen installation by his department has been completed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Christensen and unanimously carried, to accept this offer and to refer the matter to L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, for a reply to Mr. Swenson.

A letter was received from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, with attached contract for reimbursing the City of

Minneapolis for changes in the water system necessitated by alterations of State Aid Road No. 6 was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was received from the Village of Richfield with attached resolution adopted by the Richfield Village Council requesting County participation in the improvement of street intersections of Nicollet, Portland, Cedar, and 24th Avenues at 78th Street. Mr. Zimmerman, County Engineer, recommended that the county cooperate with the State Highway Department and the Village of Richfield in meeting this request.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Christensen and unanimously carried, to concur in Mr. Zimmerman's recommendation.

A contract and performance bond received from Lake Minnetonka Dredging Co. covering Project No. 533, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were received from O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. For furnishing one pull type power operated road broom, Project No. 5301-14.
 - 2. For furnishing two snow plow units, Project No. 5301-15.
- 3. For grading and erection of sectional plate pipe arch culvert, Project No. 5210.

The above specifications were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters received from the Town of Independence and the Town of Maple Grove requesting financial aid for the improvement of township roads were referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

Letters were received from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the passage of a resolution concurring in the recommendation of the Board of County Commissioners of Wright County for awarding the contract for the construction of the Hanover Bridge (County Bridge No. 4) to the Minder Engineering Company, the low bidder. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
 - 2. Recommending the adoption of resolutions approving the attached final estimate relative to the improvement of State Aid Road No. 50 and No. 9 (State Project No. 27-535-01) and setting aside an additional amount of \$1211.10 to pay for the overrun on the project. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.
 - 3. Submitting a letter from L. P. Pederson, Assistant County Engineer, and recommending that the county join with the City of Hopkins in a cooperative project for the improvement of a portion of Fifth Avenue (S.A.R. No. 18) from State Aid Road No. 3 to Trunk Highway No. 7.

A motion was made by Commissioner Ainsworth, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, and unanimously carried, to concur in Mr. Zimmerman's recommendation and to refer the matter to the legal department to assure the Board of the legality of the proposed agreement and to draft the contract therefor.

4. Requesting adoption of a resolution authorizing the payment of L. P. Pederson's expenses while att#ending a demonstration program at Grand Forks and Fargo, North Dakota. Referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

5. Copies of letters to Mr. and Mrs. Ture Hendrickson and to Mr. and Mrs. Glenn L. Hendrickson notifying them to remove the fence which is located on the roadway adjacent to their property on State Aid Road No. 51 at the Coffee Bridge between Crystal Bay and West Arm on or before August 1, 1953. Mr. and Mrs. Ture Hendrickson addressed the Board objecting to fishing by the general public on the Hendrickson property. Commissioner Hanson recommended that the matter be referred to the highway engineer to work out a satisfactory arrangement with the Hendricksons.

Commissioner Scott stated that a portion of certain tax forfeited lots on 14th and Aldrich Avenues North, namely, Lots 4, 5, and 6, Block 47, Sherburne & Beebe's Addition, which were recently sold by the county, have been used for years as an alleyway. The deed from the county made no reference to this alley and the users of this alleyway are concerned over the future of their driveway.

A motion was made by Commissioner Scott, seconded by Commissioner Christensen and unanimously carried, to refer the matter to John Sheehan of the Tax Forfeited Land Department, to contact the parties concerned and to consult with the Legal Department and the City Engineering Department with a view to establishing a twelve-foot alley.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, County Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for furnishing one sloping unit to Hennepin County for the highway department. The bids were referred to the Purchasing Agent for a report to be made at the next board meeting to be held on Tuesday, July 28, 1953.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the continuance of the proceedings in the matter of the dissolution of School District No. 133. Letters were read from Frank J. Williams, Attorney for the County Board, and from Robert E. Scott, Superintendent of Schools for Hennepin County, recommending the further continuance of the hearing, pending the disposal in Supreme Court of the appeal from the order of the County Board dissolving School District No. 52 (the adjoining and intervening school district). The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly reports received from Ed Ryah, Sheriff, and from Frank E. Adams, Veterans Service Officer, were ordered placed on file.

Applications for license to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A budget report for the Hennepin County Highway Department, received from O. A. Pearson, Budget Director, was ordered placed on file.

A contract and contract bond received from Gopher Business Forms for furnishing tax statements for the office of the County Treasurer was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from the Health Department of the City of Minneapolis requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from O. A. Pearson, Purchasing Agent, requesting that the County Auditor set aside funds from the Road and Bridge appropriation to pay for a power operated road broom was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

James H. Hennessy, representing the Victory Hospital Association, appeared before the Board relative to the application of the said association for settlement and abatement of delinquent taxes for the years 1947, 1948, and 1949. Mr. Hennessy also introduced the Board of Directors of the said hospital association.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that the application for settlement and abatement of the Victory Hospital Association taxes for the years 1947, 1948, and 1949 be approved and forwarded to the Commissioner of Taxation for consideration.
