Tuesday, January 5, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten
o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by T. J. Thompson, Deputy County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson . . . First District
Commissioner George W. Matthews . . . Second District
Commissioner Jens Christensen . . . Third District
Commissioner I.G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth . . . Fifth District

The Board proceeded to vote by secret ballot for the selection of a chairman for the ensuing year. Mr. Thompson named O.A. Pearson and E. J. Carlson to act as tellers. Commissioner Matthews received three votes, Commissioner Scott received one vote, and one ballot was blank. Mr. Thompson declared Commissioner Matthews elected chairman of the County Board for Hennepin County for the year 1954.

The Board then proceeded to ballot for the selection of a vice chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner Ainsworth received two votes, Commissioner Scott received one vote, and two ballots were blank. On the second ballot, Commissioner Ainsworth received three

votes, Commissioner Scott received one vote, and one ballot was blank. Chairman Matthews then declared Commissioner Ainsworth elected vice-chairman of the Hennepin County Board for the ensuing year.

Annual and monthly reports were received from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds and Registrar of Titles, and ordered placed on file.

A letter from G. Howard Spaeth, Commissioner of Taxation, confirming the appointment of Roy Haeg as Supervisor of Assessments, was read and ordered placed on file. Copies of the letter were to be supplied to each of the commissioners.

A letter was read from Paper, Calmenson & Company inviting the county officers to a buffet supper with refreshments, to be held at their plant on Walnut Street and County Road B in St. Paul, on Wednesday, January 27, 1954, from 5:00 to 9:00 o'clock P.M. The commissioners were directed to notify the Clerk to the Board if they intend to accept the invitation.

Letters were received from O.A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

1. Notifying the board of the acceptance of the low bid of Eddy's Baking Company to supply bakery goods to the Hennepin County Jail for the year 1954, and requesting that the County Auditor set aside funds to pay for said contract.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson, that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside

the sum of \$3679.20 from the Sheriff-Jail Fund to the Eddy's Baking Company contract for supplying bakery goods to the Hennepin County Jail, and

That the Chairman of the County Board be directed to sign the contract when bond is approved.

2. Notifying the Board that he had accepted the bid of Standard Oil Company for furnishing gasoline to the County Highway Department, being Project No. 5402-1, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for said contract.

Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, be directed to set aside the sum of \$13,936.80 from the Road and Bridge Fund to the Standard Oil Company contract to pay for said gasoline; and

That the Chairman of the County Board be directed to sign the contract when bond is approved.

3. Notifying the Board that he had accepted the low bid of M.B. Coffee Co. Inc. for furnishing coffee to the Hennepin County Jail for the year 1954, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth that the bid of McGarvy Coffee Company be accepted instead of the M.B. Coffee Co. Inc. bid.

Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner
Hanson, to amend the motion and that the matter be laid over for one
week.

Commissioner Ainsworth called for a Road and Lake Committee meeting for Thursday, January 14, 1954, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., and Mr. Zimmerman was directed to notify the representatives of the Geological Department of the meeting.

Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that employees of the Road and Lake Department be paid on the salary schedules for the classifications under which they are working.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Ainsworth, to refer the matter to the Road and Lake Committee.

The vote on the motion as amended was as follows: Ainsworth yea, Christensen nay, Hanson yea, Scott nay, Chairman Matthews yea.

A statement of balances in the County Revenue Allowances as of December 31, 1953, received from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published with the proceedings of the Board and placed on file.

Annual reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and Howard W. Perkins, County Surveyor, and a monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Agricultural Agent, were received and ordered placed on file.
