Tuesday, February 16, 1954

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Christensen, Scott, and Chairman Matthews.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Letters were received from Elmer H.Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application from the Town of Plymouth for conveyance to said town of certain tax forfeited lands, and submitting resolutions pertaining to a proposed sale of tax forfeited lands. Referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

A letter from G. Howard Spaeth, Commissioner of Taxation, inquiring whether or not the County of Hennepin desires to appear at a hearing on the application of Woodhill Country Club for reduction in assessed valuations was read. Commissioner Ainsworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, that Roy Haeg, Supervisor of Assessments, be asked to represent Hennepin Country at the hearing and express the views of the County Board.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from E. J. Shannon, Assistant County Attorney, informing the Board that the petition of Harry E. Bruhn and others asking for a change of a town road, the removal of a bridge, and the establishment of a grade crossing is not within the jurisdiction of the County Board was read and a copy of said letter was ordered sent to the attorneys for the petitioners.

A letter from the Board of Public Welfare relative to rates for care of prisoners from Hennepin County was read and the Clerk to the Board was requested to acknowledge receipt of the letter and acceptance of the charges.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, relative to the specifications and bids for hot plant mix bituminous material was read. Commissioner Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Christensen that all bids be rejected and that O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, be directed to readvertise for bids for said hot plant mix bituminous material on new specifications, eliminating the reference to various districts, bids on the second advertising to be opened on Tuesday, March 2, 1954, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth nay,
Christensen yea, Hanson absent, Scott yea, Chairman Matthews yea.

Motion carried.

A letter from the Gay Paree Night Club, Fairmont, Minnesota, requesting information relative to regulations and permits for dance hall licenses in Hennepin County was read. The Clerk to the Board was requested to acknowledge receipt of the letter, stating that the County has no special laws governing dance hall permits.

Letters were received from O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board that the low bid of Miller-Davis Company had been accepted for furnishing certificate of title sheets for the office of the Registrar of Titles, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for said sheets. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Recommending acceptance of the bid of Photostat Corporation for furnishing photostat paper and asking that funds be set aside to pay for said paper. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Recommending that the bids for furnishing a four-door sedan to the Sheriff's office be rejected. Commissioner Christensen moved, seconded by Commissioner Scott, to refer the letter to the next Board meeting. Motion unanimously carried.
- 4. Notifying the Board that the low bids had been accepted for furnishing three 2-door sedans, two Police Special Station Wagons, and three 2-door Patrol Coaches for the Sheriff's office and asking that funds be set aside to pay for said cars. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board that subject to their approval, he will retain the 1948 Chrysler sedan he is now driving. Referred to the next Board meeting.
- 2. Suggesting that the Board explore the matter of leasing cars from private owners for use by the Sheriff's office. Referred to the Budget and Purchasing Agent.

A letter from J. P. Liemandt, State Game Warden, requesting land for a boat house site at Lake Minnetonka, was read and referred to the County Engineer and Attorney for the County Board.

An agreement between the County and the City of Minneapolis for paving France Avenue South from West 44th Street to West 49th Street, with plans and specifications attached, was presented and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

A letter from L. P. Zimmerman, County Engineer, asking the Board to request special State Aid in the amount of \$25,000.00 from the State Allotment Board was read and referred to the Road and Lake Committee.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, O. A. Pearson, Budget and Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

- 1. Steel folding chairs for the Home School for Boys.
- 2. Farm Feed for the Home School for Boys.
- 3. Tires and Tubes for the County Highway Department.
- 4. Special Aggregate "Buckshot" for Seal Coat.

All of the above bids were referred to Mr. Pearson for a report to be made at the next Board meeting.
